Ms. Bishop-Pullan described the scope of the program and the statistical data provided to the State of CT for the success of our program. Ms. Fountain did not have any additional information to share.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kiwanis Club will kick-off - Kiwanis Smile October 22, with books and donating a compressor to K.T. Murphy dental clinic. • Health Insurance Exchange enrollment (Access CT) Ms. Fountain announced that Maria Millan passed her exam and we just received our equipment (laptop). • Well Testing – Ordinance Change Now testing for uranium and arsenic, dropping VOCs, continuing pesticides. <p>Director Ted Jankowski</p>	<p>Mr. Jankowski gave an update to the Health Commission regarding the impact of drug use in Stamford. He stated that the main usages of drugs in Stamford are marijuana, crack and prescription drugs (Oxycodone).</p>

<p style="text-align: center;">Childcare Learning Center Head Start/Early Head Start Program</p> <p>Presented by:</p> <p>Imelda D’Luc, Head Start Director Barbara Garvin-Kester, CEO</p>	<p>Ms. D’Luc presented background information about the Head Start program that started in the 70’s. They developed a child development program focusing on the child’s school readiness and social confidence and they offer comprehensive services including health screenings (health, vision, height and weight, dental), guidance in obtaining health insurance to the families.</p> <p>There was a lengthy discussion on the sequestration impact of the Head Start Program. Ms. D’Luc and Mrs. Garvin-Kester explained their creativity to keep the program running. With the reduction in funding they had a reduction in participation in the programs equivalent to one (1) classroom. No children who had been participating in the program were dropped from it, but they were unable to accept as many new children into the program as would have been possible had there been no sequestration. There is a strong likelihood that there will be a second round of sequestration in April.</p>	
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<p>Health Commission Sponsored Presentation on Health Insurance</p>	<p>Ms. Fountain has facilitated access to free space at UCONN Stamford for this.</p> <p>Tentative date = week of Nov 11</p> <p>Speakers from CT Voices for Children – mostly child oriented, hopefully can speak about adult issues as well; how to get health insurance</p> <p>Title – Access to Health Insurance? Defer to Speakers?</p> <p>Panel Discussion – small presentation from each speaker, followed by Q&A</p> <p>Evening presentation – 6 – 6:30pm start - dependent upon UCONN availability.</p> <p>Tables for other organizations – Access CT, Fishman w/Medassist, Maria Millan, Insurance companies involved with ACA (UnitedHealthcare (Husky programs), service providers, etc.</p> <p>Refreshments – can HC request donations from community?
