Video: 00:21 Mr. Dellaselva reported that this was a 5-year lease agreement- to Sacred Heart U. which, allowed them to operate a radio broadcasting system which had the benefit to the City of allowing them to use the system in case of emergencies. Vice Chair Rinaldi stated that she had specific views on the Government Center's use, and that is that the 10th floor is the purview of the Mayor for his use and as such, should be reserved for Government Agencies only. Mr. Louizos advised that the views of a radio show should not be construed as those of the City, and Mr. Martin said there was nothing in the lease which provided for what equipment may be brought into the building and its location to accommodate the broadcasting of the potential Lessee. Ms. Murphy agreed, stating that this is something that should be spelled out in the lease. While Mr. Jankowski emphasized that this was a great concept that the City was lacking and that he did not want it delayed, the Board members concurred that a more appropriate place for a system that could be used in case of public emergency should be located in the same area as the City's Emergency Communications Center. On a motion by Mr. Martin, which was seconded by Ms. Rinaldi, the Board agreed by unanimous vote to hold this item, in favor of allowing the Department to locate a more suitable space for this tenant.

He explained that this project was in design, anticipating construction next summer. Board member Murphy stated that schools should receive adequate funds and use them in the most efficient way. Ms. Rinaldi noted that there was a plan, priorities were determined, and we should move on this item. | | Mr. Casolo explained that while \$3.5 million was approved, the bids came in higher due to the initial uncertainty of the cost, but were raised due to discovery of asbestos and to fund contingency and clerk of the works, putting the cost closer to \$4.4 million. Chairman Abbazia wanted to know how much longer the building would last (estimated at 50 years by Mr. Casolo) if the City spent this money, wanting to avoid a cascade of more and more funds. Mr. Casolo explained that to protect a building you start with its core and the roof, which was already new. The Board acted to approve this item by unanimous vote. (Mr. Martin was out of the room when the vote was taken, but went on the record that he was in support of approval). | |

He noted that the contract included tasks including a master plan, a survey, construction documents for a rest room building renovation and construction documents for re-alignment of the softball fields, all which will take shape through a public process. Mr. Louizos noted that informing the public was tailor made as a use for the City’s website. Chairman Abbazia stated that this plan as it was explained, ensured a better use for valuable City land. Ms. Murphy objected to construction drawings being included in a plan where the uses can change. Mr. Bosak added that both the elected Boards and the public should be involved at the earliest time in the process so as to provide input. On a motion by Mr. Louizos, which was seconded by Ms. Rinaldi, the Board approved this agreement by a vote of 4-2-0, with Mr. Bosak and Ms. Murphy dissenting.
