At a Regular Meeting conducted January 20, 2022, the Environmental Protection Board of the City of Stamford (“EPB”) took the following action pertaining to the following permit application in accordance with the statutory provisions of the “Inland Wetland and Watercourse Regulations of the City of Stamford.”

**#2021-18 - Main Street Pedestrian Bridge - City of Stamford Engineering Bureau:** To construct a pedestrian bridge across the Rippowam River between Main Street and Mill River Street proximate to wetlands, watercourses, and special flood hazard areas located within the non-drinking water supply watershed of the Rippowam River. Approximately 5,675 square feet of wetlands setback, 3,205 square feet of floodplain will be impacted by the proposed activities according to the applicant. The project area is situated within the base floodplain and floodway of the Rippowam River (“Flood Insurance Rate Map”, 09001C-0516G, dated July 8, 2013, Zone AE, elevation 12.3 feet NAVD 88).

**APPLICATION APPROVED WITH CONDITIONS.**

Information pertaining to this matter is on file and open for public inspection in the EPB office at 888 Washington Boulevard. Any action of the Environmental Protection Board may be appealed to the Superior Court within fifteen (15) days of publication of this notice in accordance with Section 8.1 of the Regulations.
