The appellant was granted an extension of time to December 20, 2021 • Ms. Early read through the Director of Health report that was provided by Ms. Bishop-Pullan. • 347 Flu vaccines have been given at employee & community events, as well as on Wednesdays at Henry Street Clinic. • All clinics are running with a total of 548 visits. • There's currently one community nurse resignation for the end of the year, one school nurse position opened and one nurse going on maternity leave in January. • Nurses are seeing 30 – 60 students a day. Some nurses are seeing 60 – 90 students a day. • Ms. Olson stated she's concerned by the overwhelming number of students nurses are seeing daily and would like the Health Department to provide a more detailed report regarding the type of nursing visits. • There is an increase in COVID-19 cases, contact tracing efforts continue. The Health Department has not received as much support from the State.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Inspector Marjorie Beauchette conducted an inspection to ensure all tenants were vacated. Re-inspection is set to be conducted on December 20 to confirm the bathroom and kitchen are removed.

- Vaccine Equity (VEPF) grant is set to end on December 31. ELC2 grant begins on March 1, with focus on Contact Racing, vaccines, testing and outreach.
- The Health Department is completing shelter plans, as well as reviewing additional plans with *All Clear*.
- MRC/CERT recognition event will be held on December 13.
- The City of Stamford has a new administration.
- COVID 19 Vaccination rates for ages 12 and above is 96%. Second highest vaccination rate State wide. Making good headway with COVID-19 vaccinations for ages 11 and under.
- Opened Disaster Recovery Center for FEMA providing assistance to the over 369 families and businesses who suffered losses due to remnants of Hurricane Ida.
- Pushing forward with grant funding for various projects including a Police Academy.
- Mr. Jankowski announced Ellen Bromley's retirement as Director of Social Services, and promotion of Sharona Cowan as the new Director of Social Services. Ellen will remain as a seasonal employee until Sharona's old position is filled.
