# RESOLUTION NO. 4125 CONCERNING THE CHARGE OF THE 19<sup>th</sup> CHARTER REVISION\_COMMISSION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section C1-40-5 of the City of Stamford Charter, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 7-188 of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Board Representatives has initiated the process of charter revision; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7-190(a) of said General Statutes, the Board of Representatives has appointed a 19th Charter Revision Commission consisting of fifteen electors; and

WHEREAS, Section 7-190(b) of said Connecticut General Statutes provides that the Board of Representatives may make recommendations to the Commission and the Commission shall in its report comment on each recommendation which it has been directed to consider, and

WHEREAS, the Commission may also consider other items for inclusion in the Charter, other changes to the Charter, and such other items as it deems desirable or necessary, and such items and/or changes shall be included in its report.

# NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE 31<sup>ST</sup> BOARD OF REPRESENTATIVES.

A. The 19th Charter Revision Commission shall review and make recommendations on the following subjects, as approved in the attached minutes:

#### PREAMBLE

a. Generally update the Preamble to reflect the mission and diversity of Stamford, and if appropriate, add a resident's bill of rights.

- C. The Commission shall, in its report, comment on each recommendation which it has been directed to consider and on any other changes that said Commission has deemed desirable.
- D. The first meeting of the Commission shall be held in March, 2022. At said meeting the Commission shall elect a chairperson from among its members.
- E. The Commission shall submit its draft report to the Board of Representatives on or before June 7, 2023.
- F. The Commission shall terminate upon acceptance or rejection of its final report by the Board of Representatives.
- G. The Commission shall make any considerations based on the law and legal advice of counsel hired for this specific purpose.

This resolution was approved by a roll call vote of 34-0-0 at the regular monthly meeting of the 31<sup>st</sup> Board of Representatives held on March 7, 2022.
