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- Environmental Health: Completed a lot of inspections of temporary events. Housing task force is very busy working on complaints / concerns regarding housing.
- Administration – Finance System. A new finance system is in place which encompasses purchasing, payments, licensing and permitting.
- Community Nursing: The department agreed to work with CDC and DPH on Early Childhood Immunization Patterns for children born in 2018. The goal is to understand what’s changed in the immunizations that are most likely received and missed in this age group. We are targeting parents, providers and day care centers to understand barriers to care.
- Community health workers, nurses and other staff will be working with the community providing outreach assessment and data collection. Also conducting surveys with parents and providers, including intercept interviews where parents congregate.
- Worked with Building One Community focusing on preschoolers and concerns from parents in order to find solutions.
- The goal is to obtain information regarding perceptions of vaccines and provide solutions by increasing education.
