#### CALL TO ORDER:

Mr. Newman called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. and introduced the Commission Members and staff present.

Mr. Newman introduced the first item on the agenda.

- ➤ <u>PUBLIC PARTICIPATION SESSION</u>: Each individual requesting to speak shall send a Chat Message to the Chair stating their name and address for the record. Public participation comments shall be limited to 3 minutes.¹
  - 1. Alex Martinez, representing the family of Yuliana Arias Lozano, who was who was hit by a car on Washington Boulevard in December 2022. Mr. Martinez wanted to report the family has decided to purchase a memorial park bench and wanted to thank the Commission for bringing up this issue at the April meeting and also to thank Mr. Murray for working with the family on getting the memorial bench.

➤ AMENDED AND RESTATED LEASE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF STAMFORD AND THE HALLOWEEN YACHT CLUB, INC.: The City of Stamford ("Lessor") and The Halloween Yacht Club, Inc. ("Lessee") were parties to a certain Lease Agreement dated April 13, 2010 and commencing on November 8, 2006 (the "Original Lease"). The Lessor and Lessee now wish to amend and restate the Original Lease to extend the Term, expand the Demised Premises and clarify the parties' respective responsibilities.

## **STAFF REPORTS:**

- ➤ Kevin Murray, Director of Parks & Recreation: Parks & Recreation Update.
  - Update on Pickleball availability in City Parks for 2023.8

Mr. Murray gave an update of the availability of pickleball courts in the City and provided details on a proposal to permanently convert the two (2) tennis courts at Cummings Park to six (6) pickleball courts.

The Commission had further discussion on who is using the various courts and when and how to research those numbers and reservation and drop-in play for the pickleball courts.

Mr. Newman asked Mr. Murray if he was looking for approval from the Commission on the conversion of the tennis courts to pickleball courts at Cummings Park, and he responded yes.

The Commission had further discussion on this conversion and Mr. Murray provided additional details of the project.

Mr. Newman made a motion to approve converting the two (2) tennis courts to six (6) pickleball courts at Cummings Park with the condition Mr. Murry provide data relative to tennis and pickleball usage at Cummings Park, which information is to be reported at the June 21, 2023 meeting.

- Athletic field lights are in process to be repaired by Shock Electric twenty-five (25) bulbs and ballasts at Cubeta Stadium. Replace nine (9) bulbs at Cummings Field #1 and Troy Field.
- Hinding Tennis, LLC to start Scalzi hockey/pickleball game court soon.

- Recreation Supervisor, Jack Lyons, stared May 1, 2023.
- Illegal vending going on at Lione Park. Notified Health Department and Stamford Police Department for assistance.
- West Beach boat ramp closed as of Thursday, May 10, 2023. Project to be completed in December.
- Cove Island Park boat ramp will be open for residents only this year. Designated trailer parking within Cove Park to assist with the anticipated overflow with the closure of the West Beach ramp.
- Working with Marketing Coordinator and Administration to launch new Parks & Recreation website.
- Eagles Boys Scout project completed at Fort Stamford by Hunter Fuda and Troop which preserved ADA handicap ramp for building; looks amazing.
- Pollinator Pathway volunteer day on April 22, 2023 was a big success. Thanks Melanie and Becky.
- Kosciuszko Park safety concern with park lights for boaters coming into the harbor with channel light. Implementing a new fixture to assist with the site perception and installing trees to block entering vehicles.
- The City of Stamford celebrated Arbor Day on April 28, 2023 at Lione Park where four (4) trees were planted within the park. Thanks to Elm Davey Tree and Bartlett for the support once again.
- Park bathrooms Citywide are now open as of May 1, 2023 for use seven (7) days a week.
- The City of Stamford celebrated Earth Day on Friday, April 21, 2023 at four (4) city parks.
- Recreation programming is booming with schedules. Spring volleyball, kickball, softball, baseball, soccer, cricket, swim lessons and more.
- Operations staff planning on beach season which starts up Memorial Day officially at all beach locations which includes Tram service at Cove Island Park.
- Seven-week summer camps are at full capacity at seven (7) sites. 200 kids on wait list.
- Recreation field checker to begin monitoring program permits May 15, 2023 Citywide.
- On April 20, 2023 Parks & Recreation Committee approved all fee increases for Parks & Recreation, Terry Conner Rink and E.G. Brennan Golf Course. Awaiting public hearing and full Board vote.
- Laz Beach Parking Management has begun as of May 6, 2023 for the weekends until Memorial Day, which will then be daily.
- Beach/park Ambassadors will begin Memorial Day weekend and work Friday through Sunday assisting with quality-of-life issues and educate park-goers about rules and regulations at Cove Island Park, West Beach, Cummings Park and Scalzi Park.

#### Good afternoon!

Happy May 3<sup>rd</sup>...or is it? Three days into opening the Quiet Zone and already we have concert speakers with their BOOM BOOM BOOM rattling our homes...DAY and NIGHT. Please check your 977-4444 dispatch records and you will see the number of calls we have had to make to plead for mercy especially in the evening when Officer Gould is not on duty. Year after year we have had the same complaint with no resolve.

I have a great idea...please read and think with open minds:

- 1. If you don't (and we know the City doesn't) have the supervision to monitor the beaches, don't open them so early. The weekend of Memorial Day is when the Quiet Zone should open. There is enough parking on the other side of the pavilion for the visitors to park.
- 2. As the City does at Cove Island...at dusk close the Parks...all of them. Nothing good happens in a park after dark!
- 3. Cummings has gates at the entrance from Shippan Avenue, which are used when the Park floods, lock them when the Park is supposed to close, then no one can access the beach area. The other gates at Soundview Avenue and the interior gate by the little bridge should be locked as well. Just think for a minute the domino affect...Officer Gould, who single-handedly does an awesome job when he is on duty, would have more time freed up to monitor the other 40 plus parks in the City. Also, if there is no access, then we (myself and my other 52 homeowners) wouldn't be calling the dispatchers who never have an officer to send..."due to priorities in the City", as well as the fact that the police who do not want to be bothered with noise at the beach, will not have to go...and...MOST IMPORTANTLY, (here's your incentive) none of you will get my emails year after year, month after month, day after day, begging you to please give us a "quality of life". The concert speakers were not invented when we bought our homes years ago, so the excuse of living near a park goes out the window...surely, if they were, we would have not moved here!

I know that this is not high on your list of to do's, but if you lived here I am sure you would do something about it. I am asking you, to really give #3 above some thought. Lou, you were at the meeting with "CAN" last Fall. You have the presentation about noise and the effect it has on the human body. Paul, I have been trying to get to you that same presentation to you, but I don't know where to send it. Please advise.
