



Pursuant to emergency powers as set forth in Connecticut General Statute Section 28-8a and Section C3-10-10 of the Charter of the City of Stamford, I hereby issue the following Executive Order.

**MAYOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER
REGARDING RAILROAD AND BUSINESS
GARAGE RENEWAL CREDIT**

Whereas, Section C3-10-10 of the Charter of the City of Stamford and Chapter 517 of the Connecticut General Statutes confer upon the Mayor emergency powers to deal with public health emergencies, such as the global pandemic of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19), to ensure that preparations of the City will be adequate to deal with the emergency, and to preserve the lives and property of the residents of Stamford; and.

Whereas, on March 11, 2020, Mayor David Martin declared a Public Health and Local Civil Preparedness Emergency in the City of Stamford; and


Whereas, Section 28-8a of the Connecticut General Statutes empowers the mayor to take such action as he deems necessary to mitigate the emergency; and

Whereas, it has come to the attention of the City of Stamford administration that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, certain permits sold by the City of Stamford were unused.

1. Effective Wednesday, July 1, 2020 all applicants in possession of paid-in-full City of Stamford Railroad Permits, Garage Permits related to Commercial Use and DSSD Permits related to Commercial Use for the months of April, May and June 2020 will receive up to a three-month future credit for the prospective permit equal to but not to exceed the amount of the April-June purchased permit; and
2. Excluded from this policy are Residential Parking Permits related to personal parking use; and

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3. Renewal Applications can be obtained through the Cashiering and Permitting Department, and applicants are required to meet all necessary documentation and payment requirements in order to secure the three months of future monthly parking permit credit.
