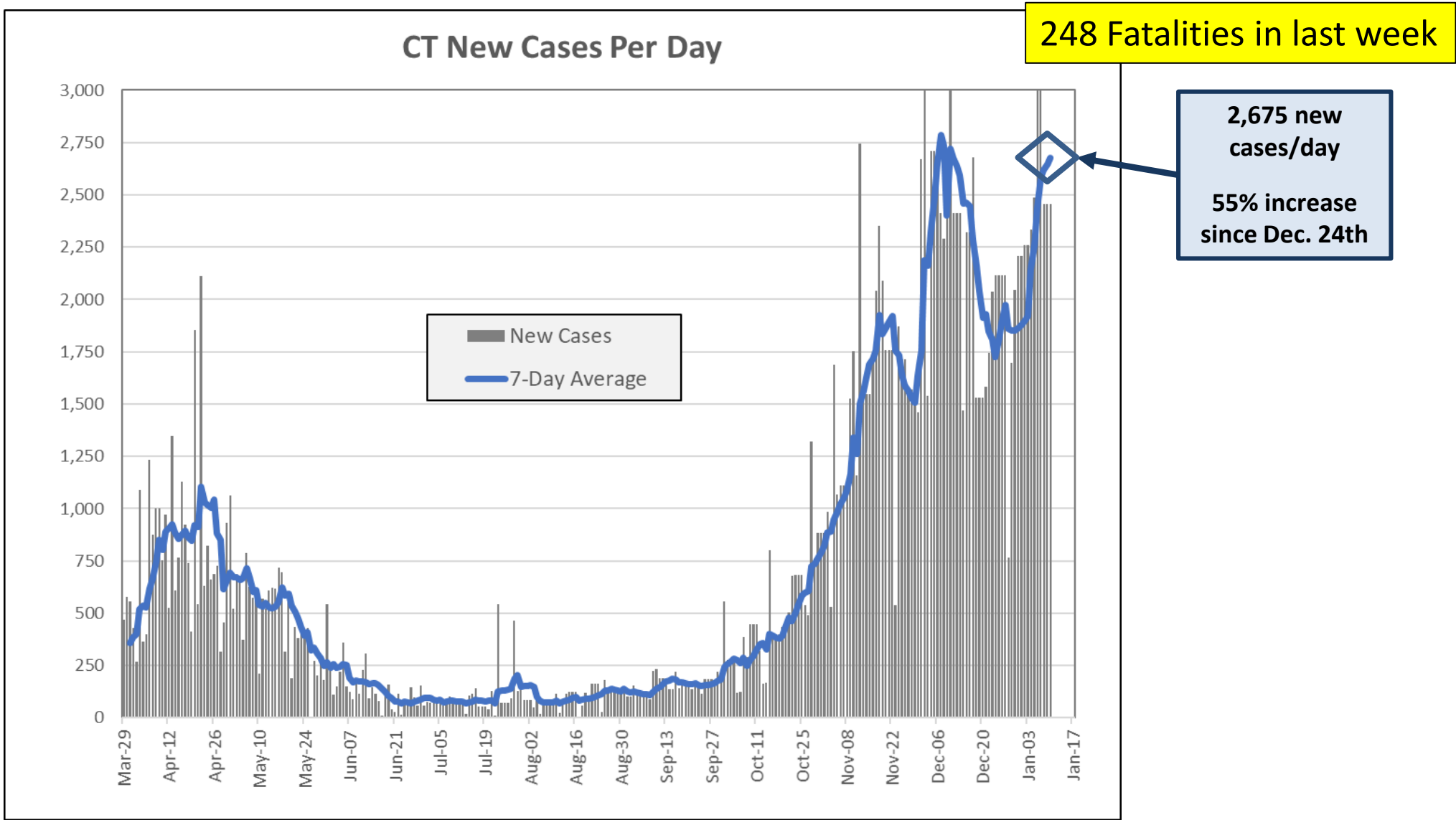

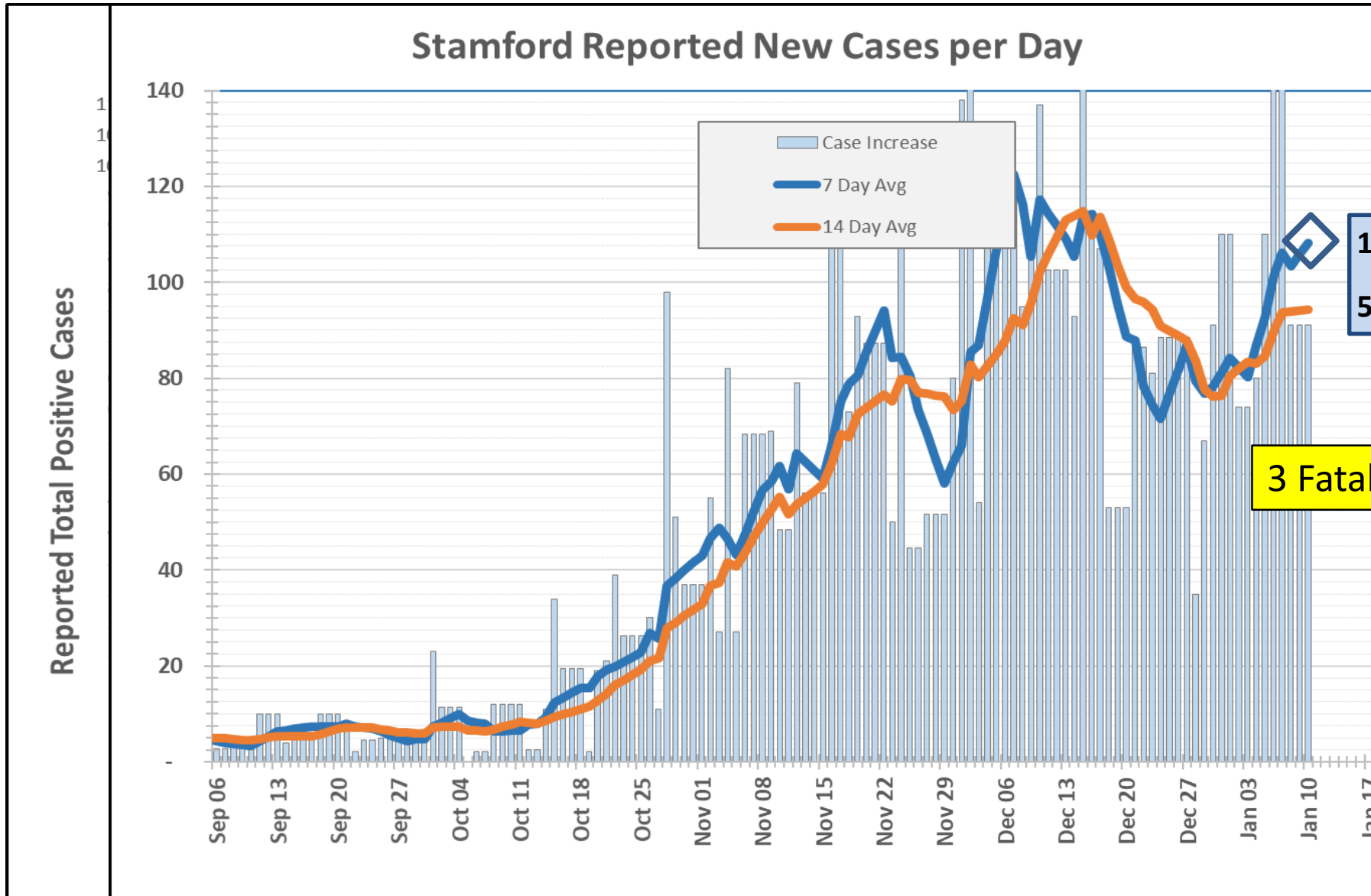

Case Trends



Phases of Vaccination

- **Phase 1A:** Very high risk and Frontline workers (has started)
 - Healthcare workers
 - First responders
 - COVID-19 vaccinators (healthcare professionals and support)
 - Long-term care
 - **Persons 75 years and older (announced yesterday by Governor)**
- **Phase 1B:** Essential functions of society/risk of severe COVID-19 illness
 - Critical municipal employees
 - Teachers
 - Persons 65 years and older
 - Persons with underlying medical conditions
- **Phase 2**
 - People at increased risk of acquiring or transmitting COVID-19
 - People with limited access to routine vaccination services
 - General population (a few)
- **Phase 3**
 - General population (everyone)



Vaccination Status

- Stamford Health
 - ~ 4,300 vaccinated so far
 - Focus on Health Care Workers
 - 2nd doses began last week
- Stamford Department of Health
 - ~ 900 vaccinated so far
 - Focus on City Front Line (EMS, Police, Fire, . . .)
 - 2nd doses starting next week
- Stamford Nursing Homes
 - Vaccinations began January 6
 - 2nd doses at the end of January
 - CVS and Walgreens administering





Vaccinations for 75 and older

- Today, Stamford began vaccinations for those 75 or older – but vaccine supply is still very limited.
- Stamford Health & City partnering and increasing the number of vaccinations starting next week.
- Everyone wanting a vaccine **MUST** have an appointment (walk-ins not provided at this time).
- If you want a vaccination please register for a vaccination appointment:

- Registered individuals will be contacted to schedule appointments.

Vaccination Notification Signup

Federal COVID Stimulus Relief: Individuals

- President Trump signed the \$1.4 trillion omnibus spending bill
- Direct relief to individuals:
 - \$600 for adults making up to \$75,000 and \$600 for each dependent child.
 - \$300/week additional unemployment benefit through March 14, 2021.
- Other relief
 - \$68 billion to purchase and distribute COVID-19 vaccines and help states conduct testing.
 - Includes a provision for "true and honest cost estimate" for medical billing.



Federal COVID Stimulus Relief: Businesses

- **Small business relief**
 - PPP loans: \$284 billion round funding for companies that did not receive a forgivable PPP loan earlier this year.
 - Full deductibility for business expenses paid with PPP proceeds.
 - \$15 billion would be reserved for live venues, independent movie theaters and cultural institutions, which have been struggling due to pandemic-forced closures.
 - \$10 billion for childcare centers to help providers safely reopen.



Federal COVID Stimulus Relief: Businesses

Businesses may be eligible for a PPP Second Draw Loan if:

- They received, and have expended or expect to expend, an original PPP loan;
- They have 300 or fewer employees;
- They had a reduction in gross receipts of 25% or more during any calendar quarter in 2020 as compared to the same quarter in 2019;

Employee Retention Credit

- They were subject to a shut-down order issued by a government agency in connection with the COVID-19 pandemic, or
- They experienced a reduction in gross receipts of 50% or more in any calendar quarter in 2020 as compared to the same quarter in 2019.



Federal COVID Stimulus Relief: Businesses

- **First Draw PPP Loans** starting today, Monday, January 11
- **Second Draw PPP Loans** on Wednesday, January 13.

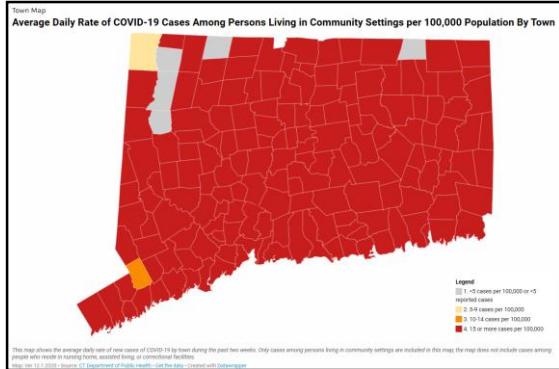
State COVID Stimulus Relief: Businesses

- **CT Business Recovery Grant**

- \$35 million in grants focused on 2,000 of Connecticut's hardest hit businesses including restaurants and hospitality.
- Grant sizes will range from \$10,000 to \$30,000.
- No application process – Businesses which meet criteria will be sent a check directly from the Department of Revenue Services (DRS).
- Checks sent out January 8, 2021.

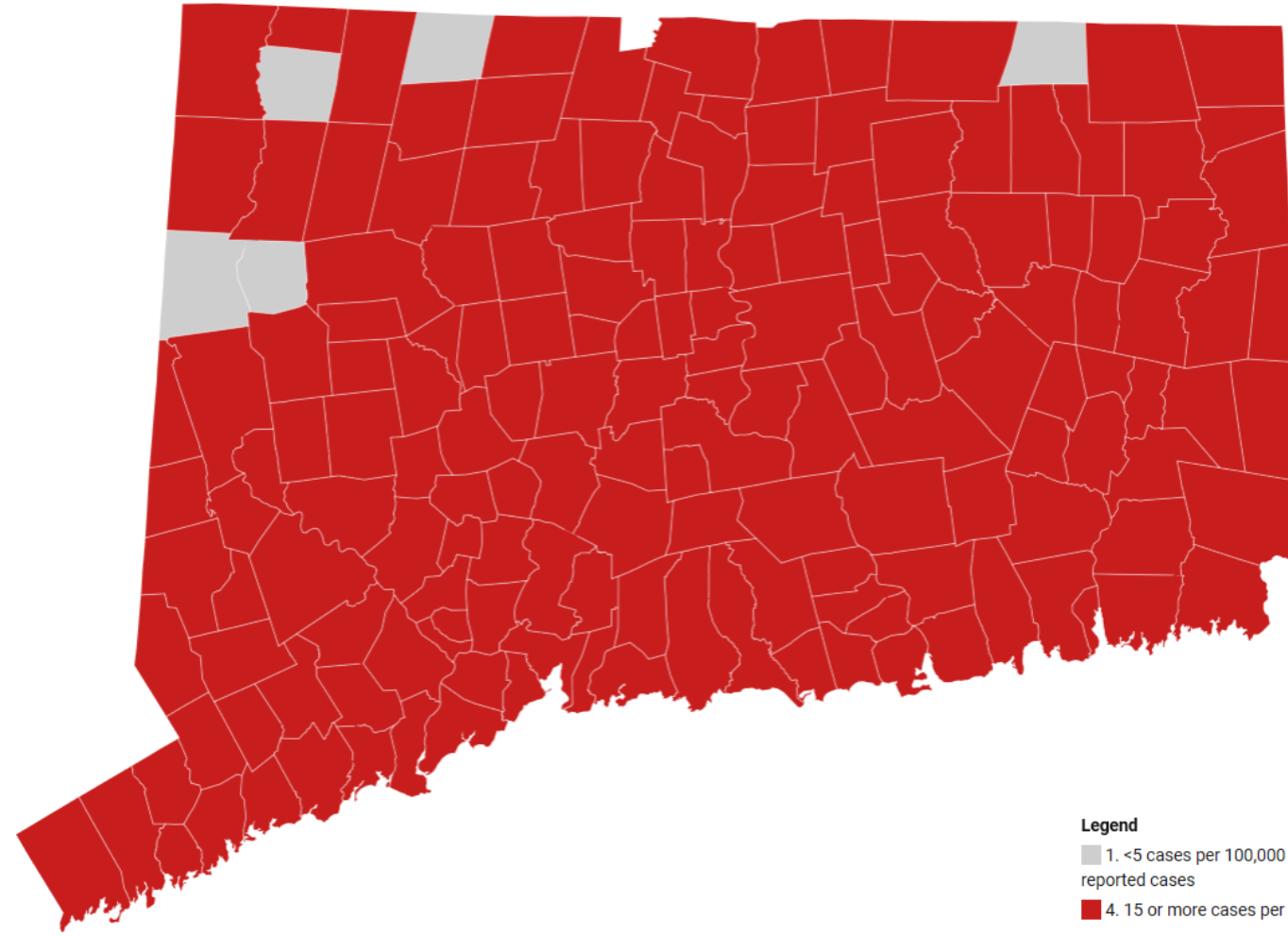

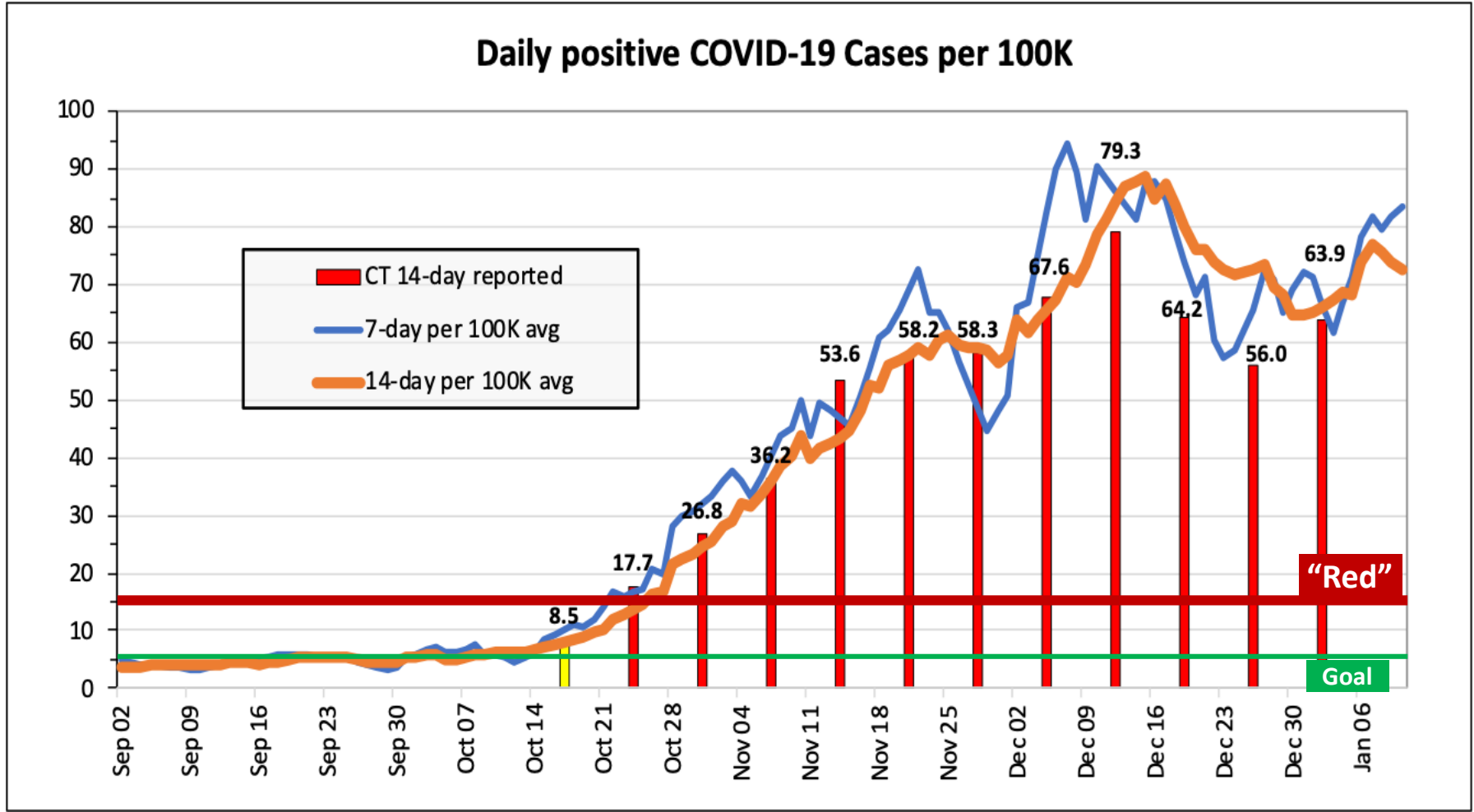
Last week

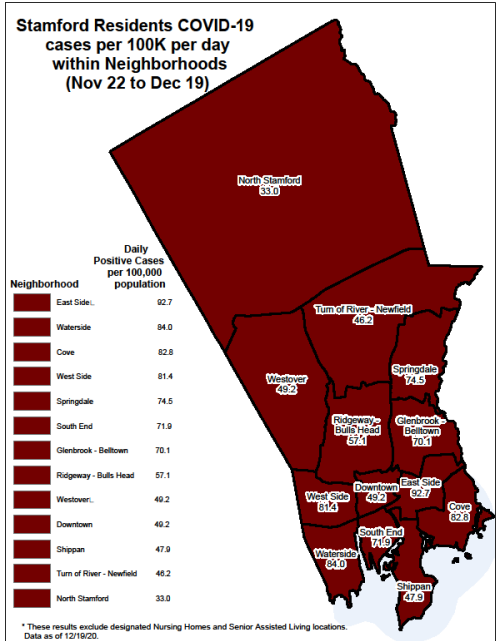

State of the City: COVID19 Neighborhood Case Levels

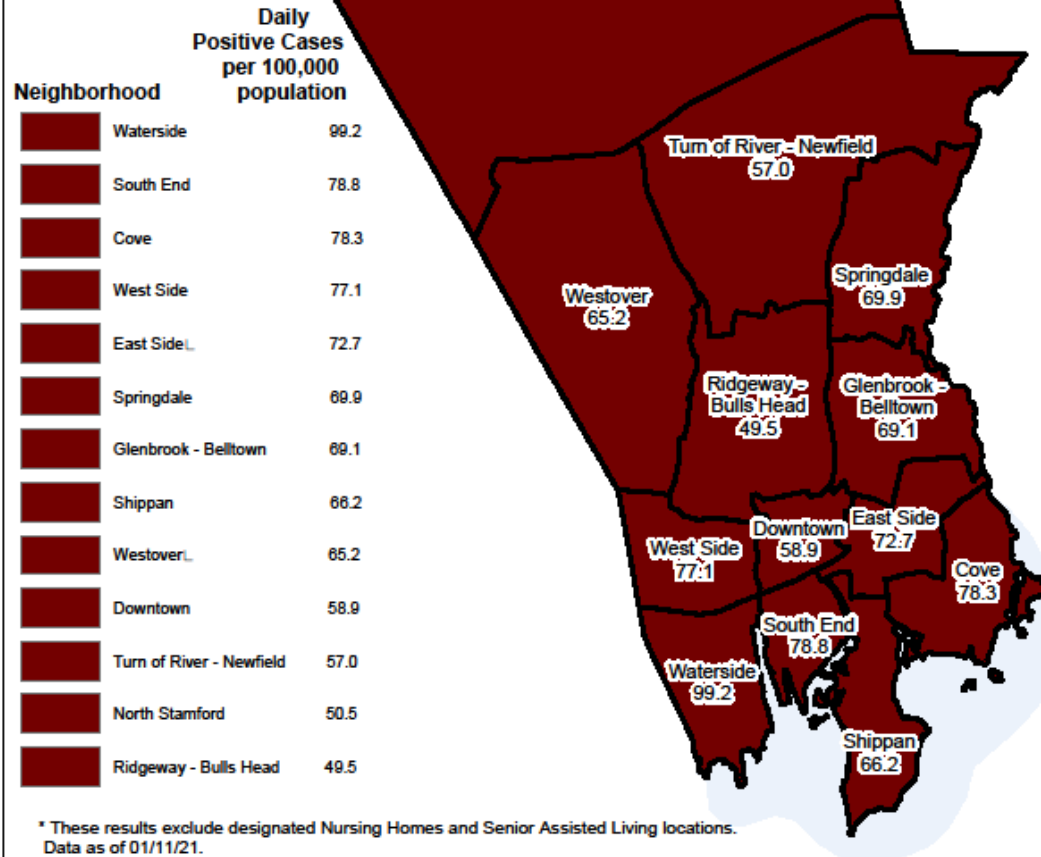

Last Neighborhood Map

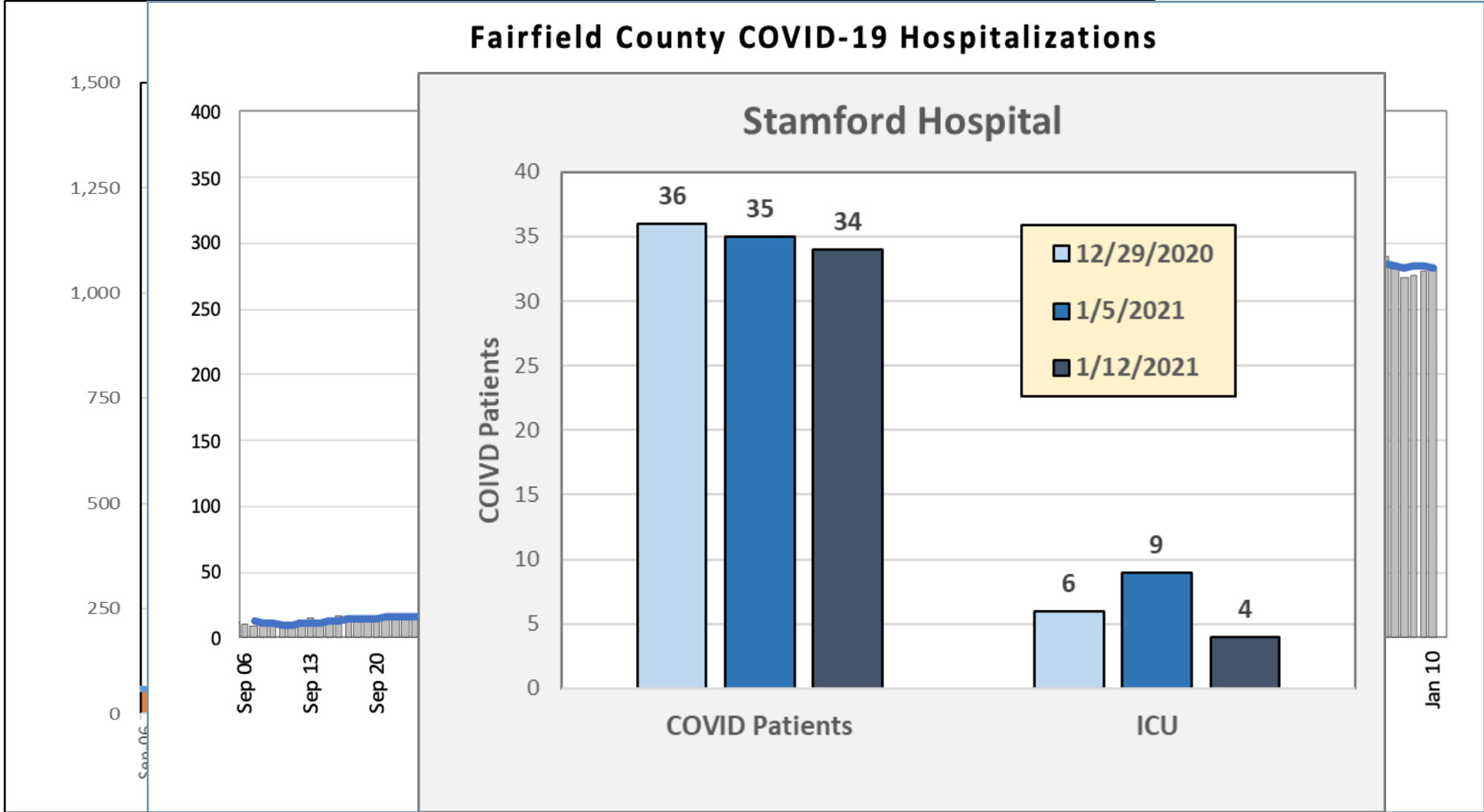
Stamford Residents COVID-19 cases per 100K per day within Neighborhoods (Dec 20 to Jan 11)



Excludes Nursing Homes/Senior Care Facilities

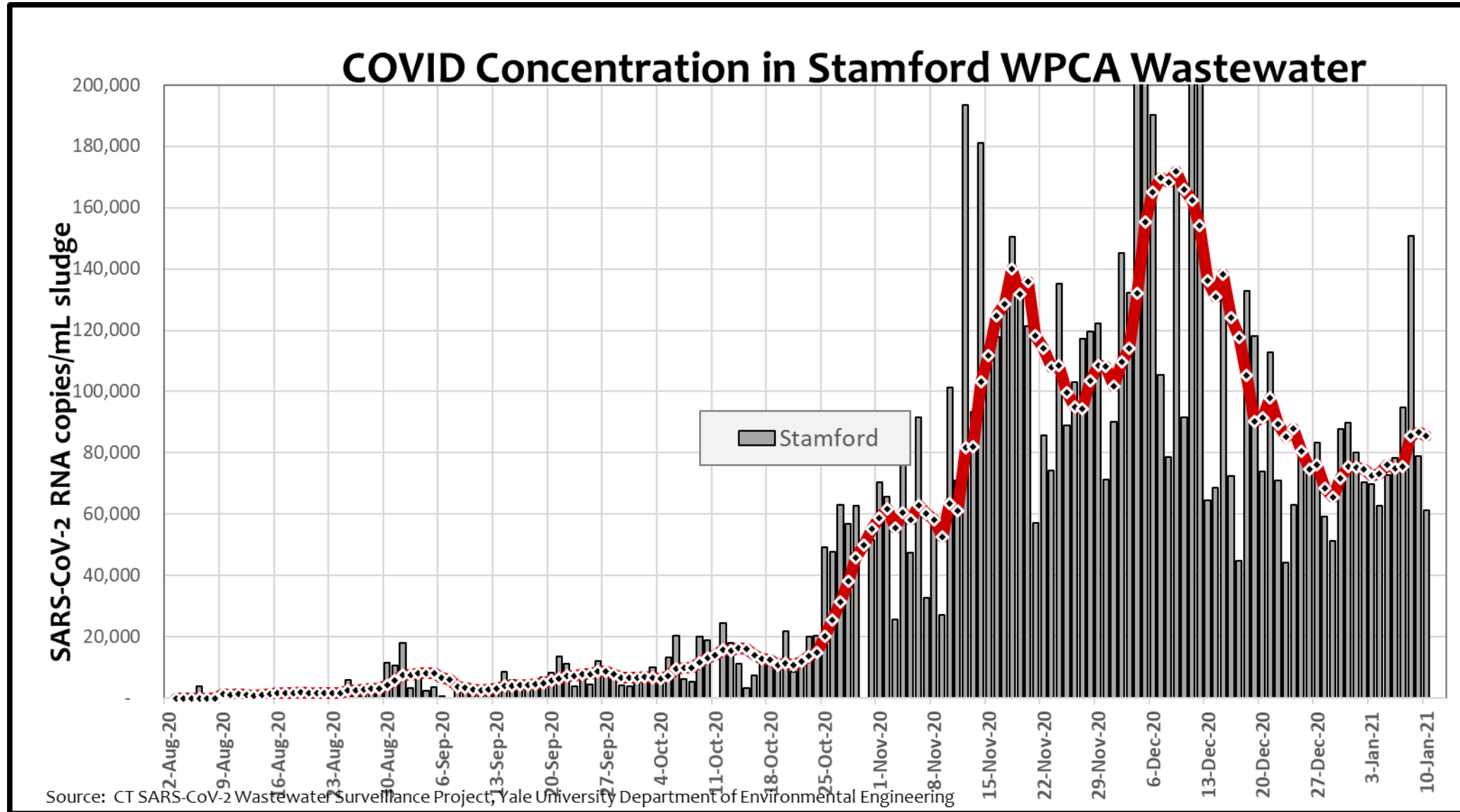

Hospitalization Rate



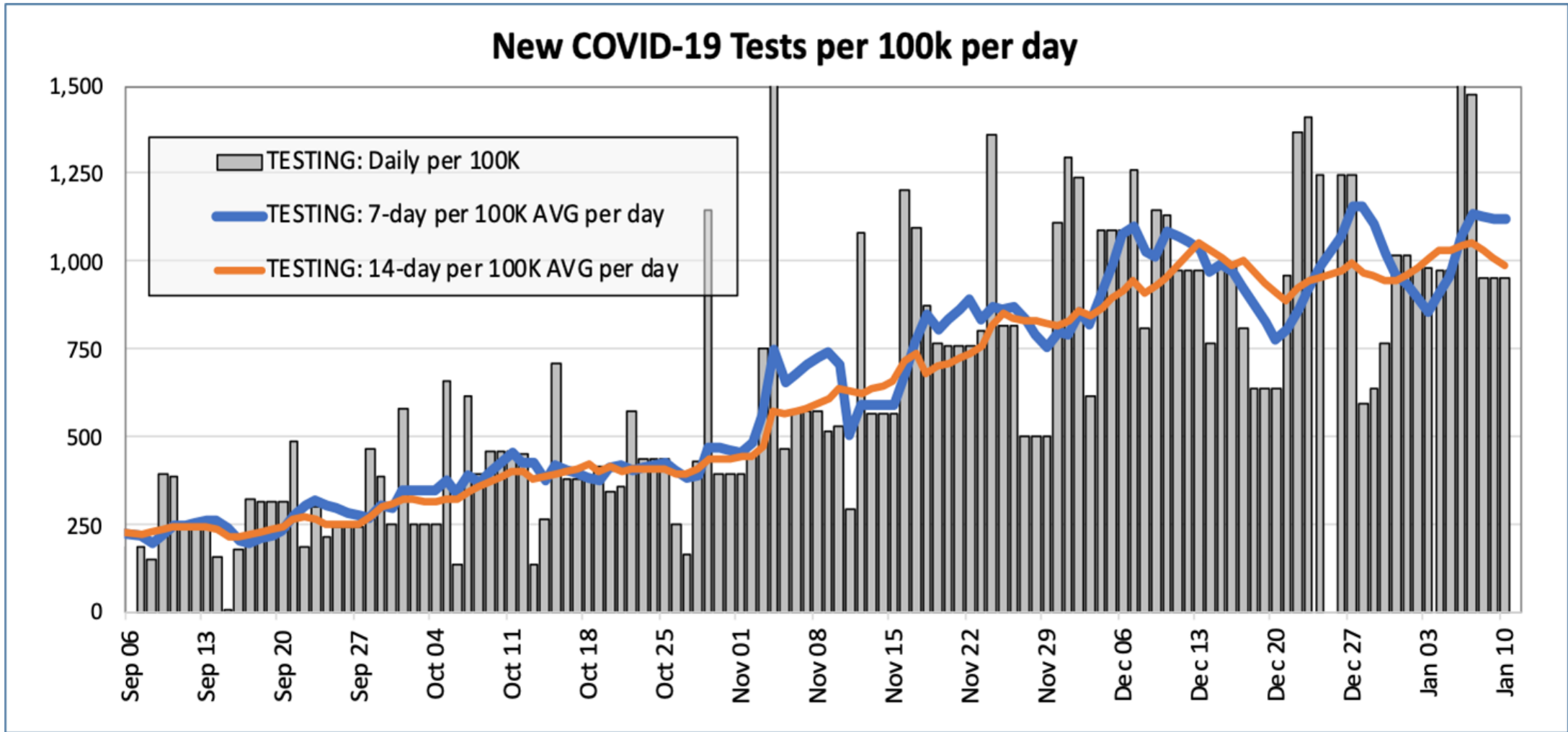

WPCA Wastewater COVID Concentration

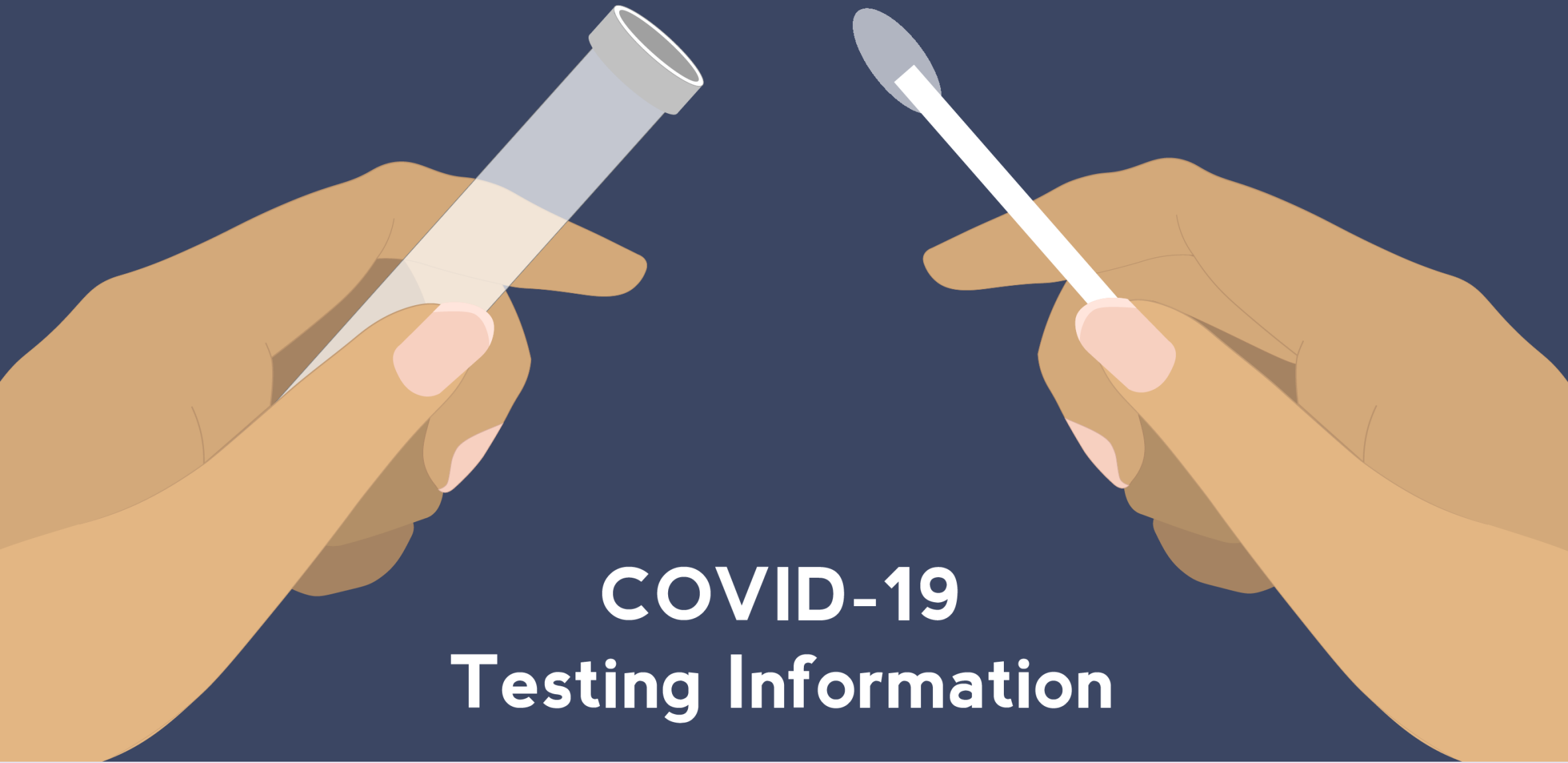
