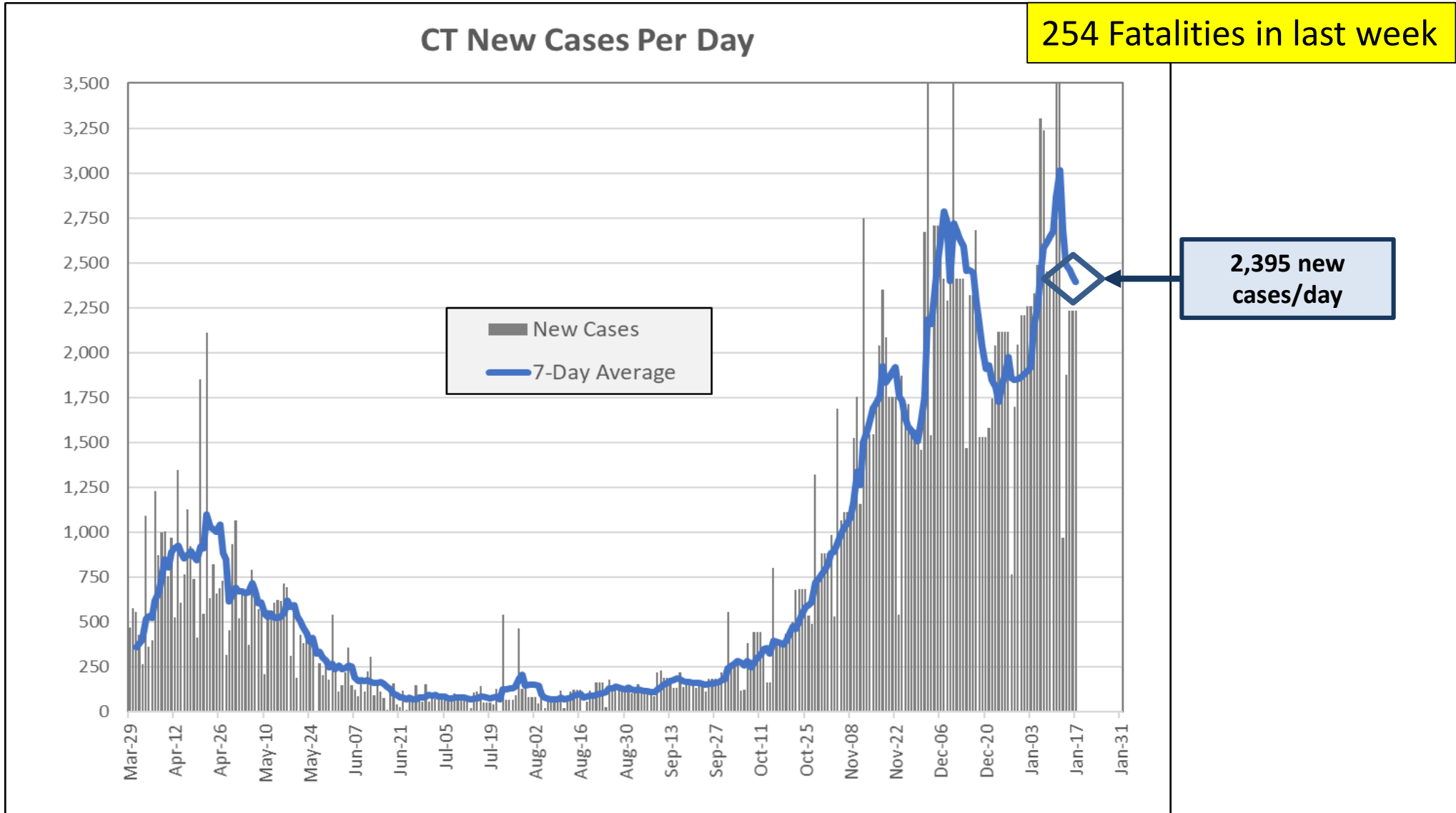

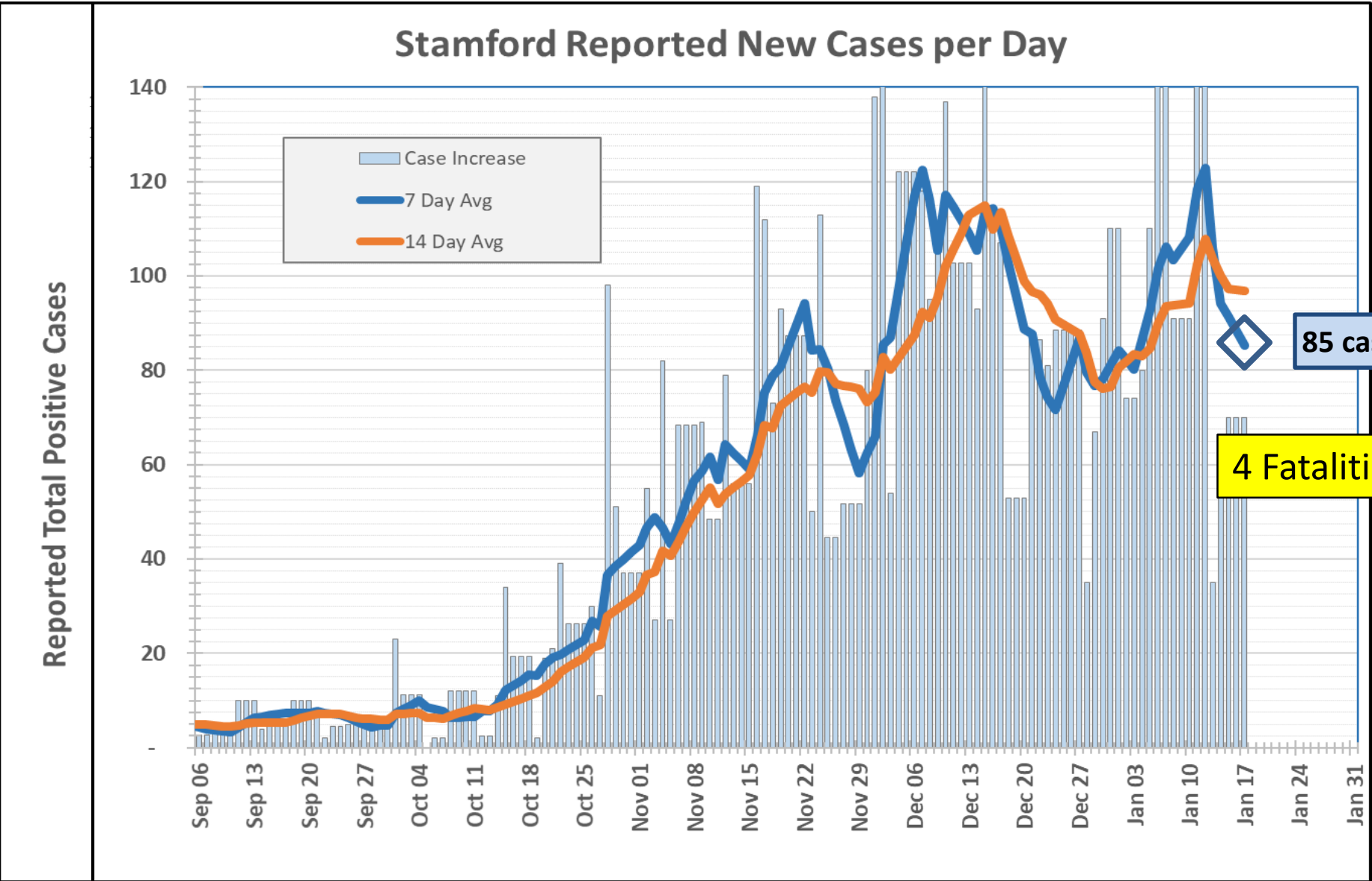
400,000 Total U.S. Fatalities from COVID-19

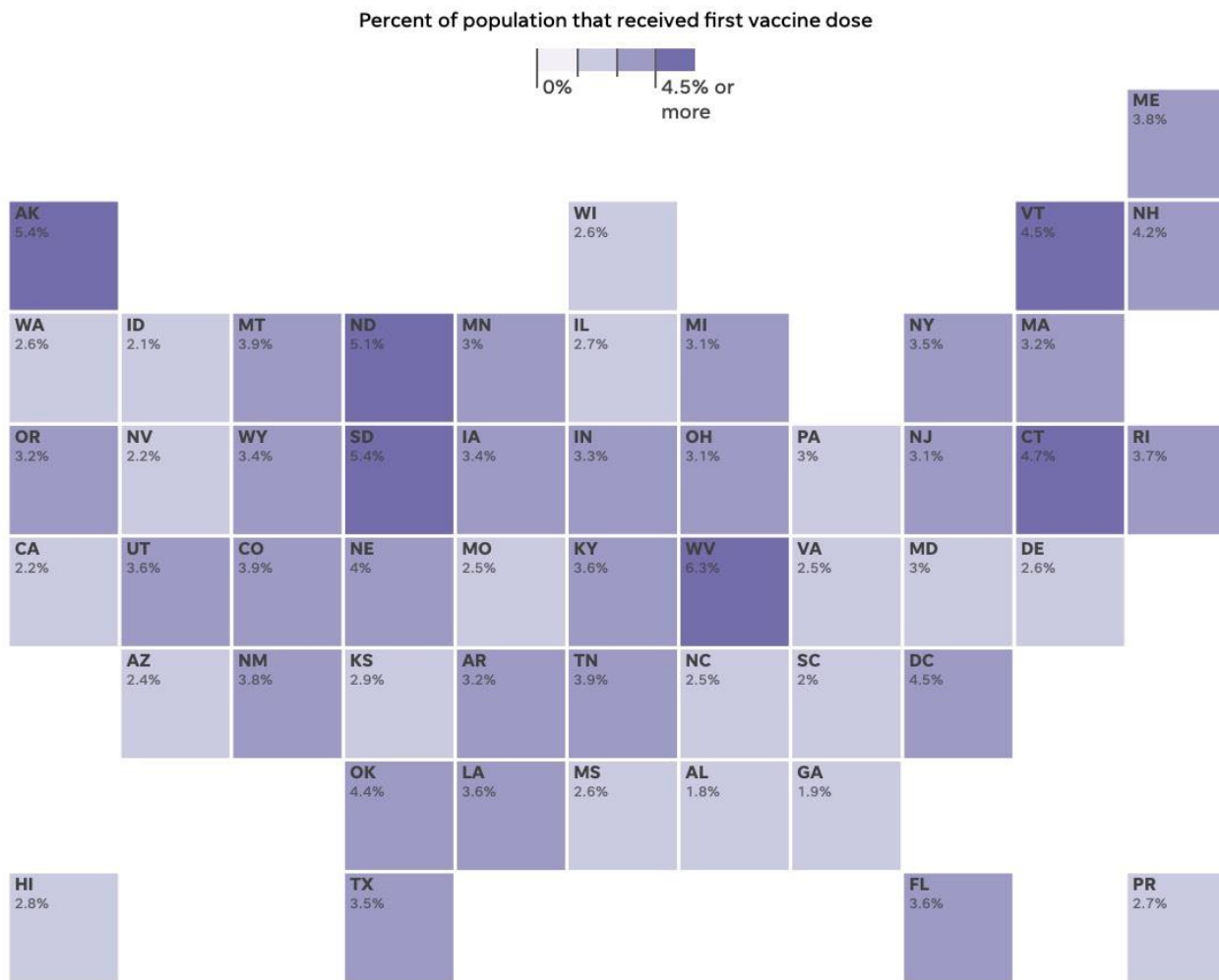

Phases of Vaccination

- **Phase 1A:** Very high risk and Frontline workers (has started)
 - Healthcare workers
 - First responders
 - COVID-19 vaccinators (healthcare professionals and support)
 - Long-term care
- **Phase 1B:** Essential functions of society/risk of severe COVID-19 illness (early February)
 - **Persons 75 years and older (announced last week by Governor)**
 - Critical municipal employees
 - Teachers
 - Persons 65 years and older
 - Persons with underlying medical conditions
- **Phase 2**
 - People at increased risk of acquiring or transmitting COVID-19
 - People with limited access to routine vaccination services
 - General population (a few)
- **Phase 3**
 - General population (everyone)



Vaccination Status

- Stamford Health
 - Several thousand vaccinated so far
 - Focus on Health Care Workers
 - 2nd doses began last week
- Stamford Department of Health
 - ~ 1,00 vaccinated so far
 - Focus on City Front Line (EMS, Police, Fire, . . .)
 - 75 and over age group
 - 2nd doses starting next week
- Stamford Nursing Homes
 - Vaccinations began January 6
 - 2nd doses at the end of January
 - CVS and Walgreens administering



City of Stamford/Stamford Health COVID19 Vaccination Program



- **Stamford Health (Stamford Hospital)** is partnering with the City of Stamford to provide COVID-19 vaccines to those who are eligible, at no out-of-pocket cost.
- Individuals 75 years of age and older can register on the **Stamford Health** website and complete the COVID19 appointment scheduling process. Appointments, this week, are available through Friday, January 22nd.
- Later this week, **Stamford Health** is introducing a new, easy to use COVID19 registration link for users to make vaccine appointments directly with **Stamford Health**, which will include a phone option for booking appointments. Please check **Stamford Health's** website for those updates.
- Phase 1a and Phase 1b qualified individuals should go to the **Stamford Health** website to register. Individuals who have provided contact information on the City of Stamford's website, Vaccination Notification Signup form, or worked with Stamford's Senior Center, will be contacted by **Stamford Health** regarding registering and scheduling a vaccine appointment. Assistance will be provided by Stamford Health staff.

Frequently Asked Questions

- **If I'm eligible for the vaccine, what is the best way to sign up?**

- StamfordHealth.org/Covid19Vaccine is the best way to get an appointment for the vaccine.

Previously, the City offered a Google Form before this signup method was available. Anyone who entered their information to the Google Form is having their information sent to Stamford Health who will reach out directly

- **What if I don't have an email or access to the internet?**

- Call Stamford Health's vaccination appointment assistance line at 203.276.7300. Operating 9 a.m. to 5 a.m. (20 hours a day)

- **Where can I get the vaccine?**

- As of today, all vaccinations for the general public are being directed to Stamford Health/Stamford Hospital. The City continues to vaccinate municipal employees (first responders, teachers, etc.)

- **Do I need health insurance to receive the vaccine?**

- No. The vaccine is free.

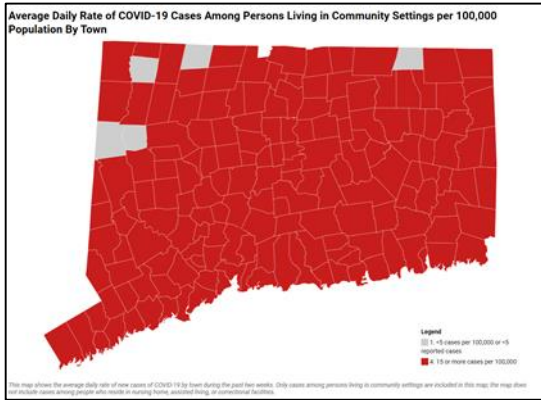
- **How much supply of the vaccine is there?**

- The City and Stamford Health receive thousands of vaccines a week. With this in mind, vaccines are in limited supply so it may take some time before your appointment is scheduled

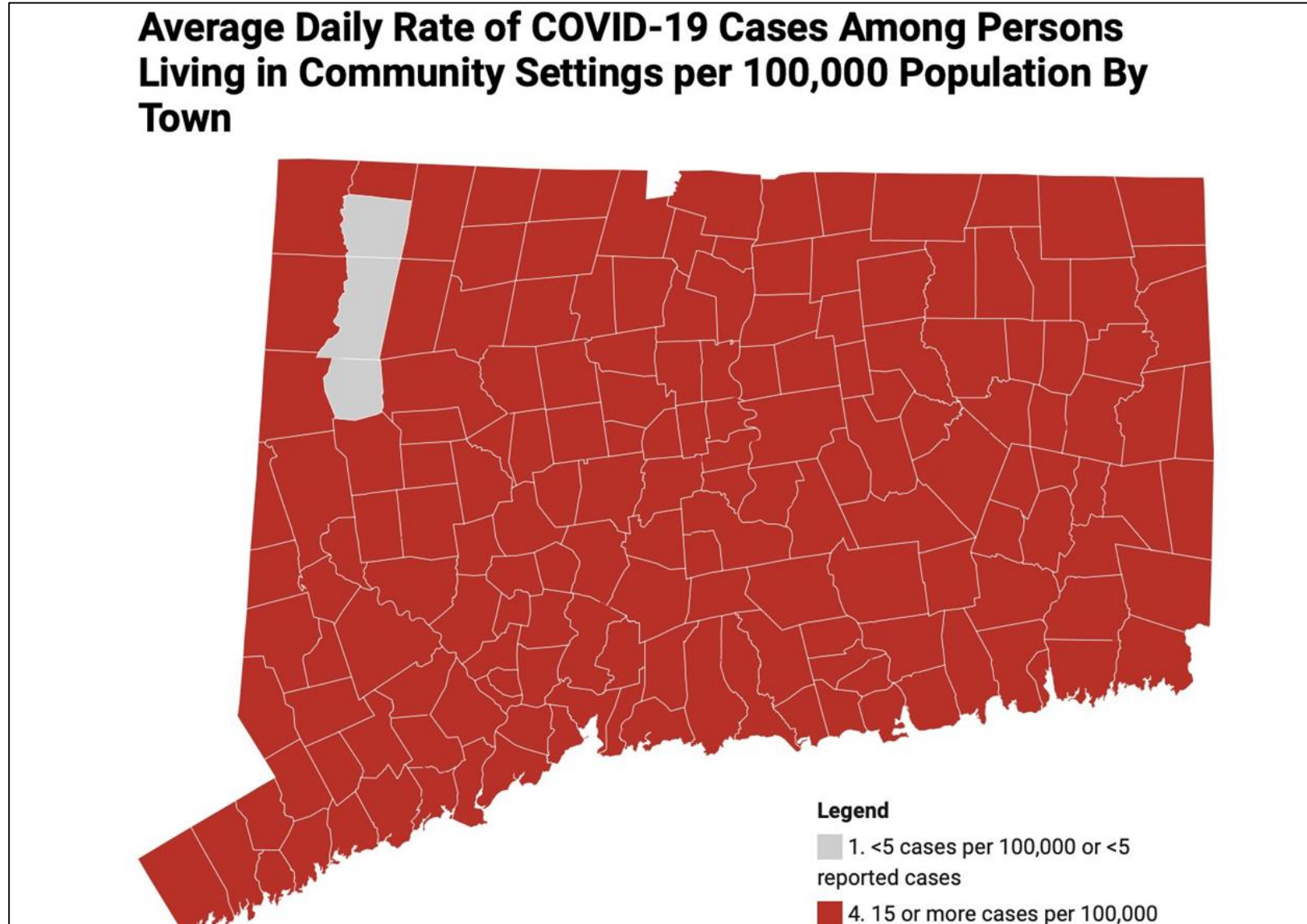
- **How will it be determined when the next phase begins?**

- Vaccination phases are directed by the State Department of Public Health

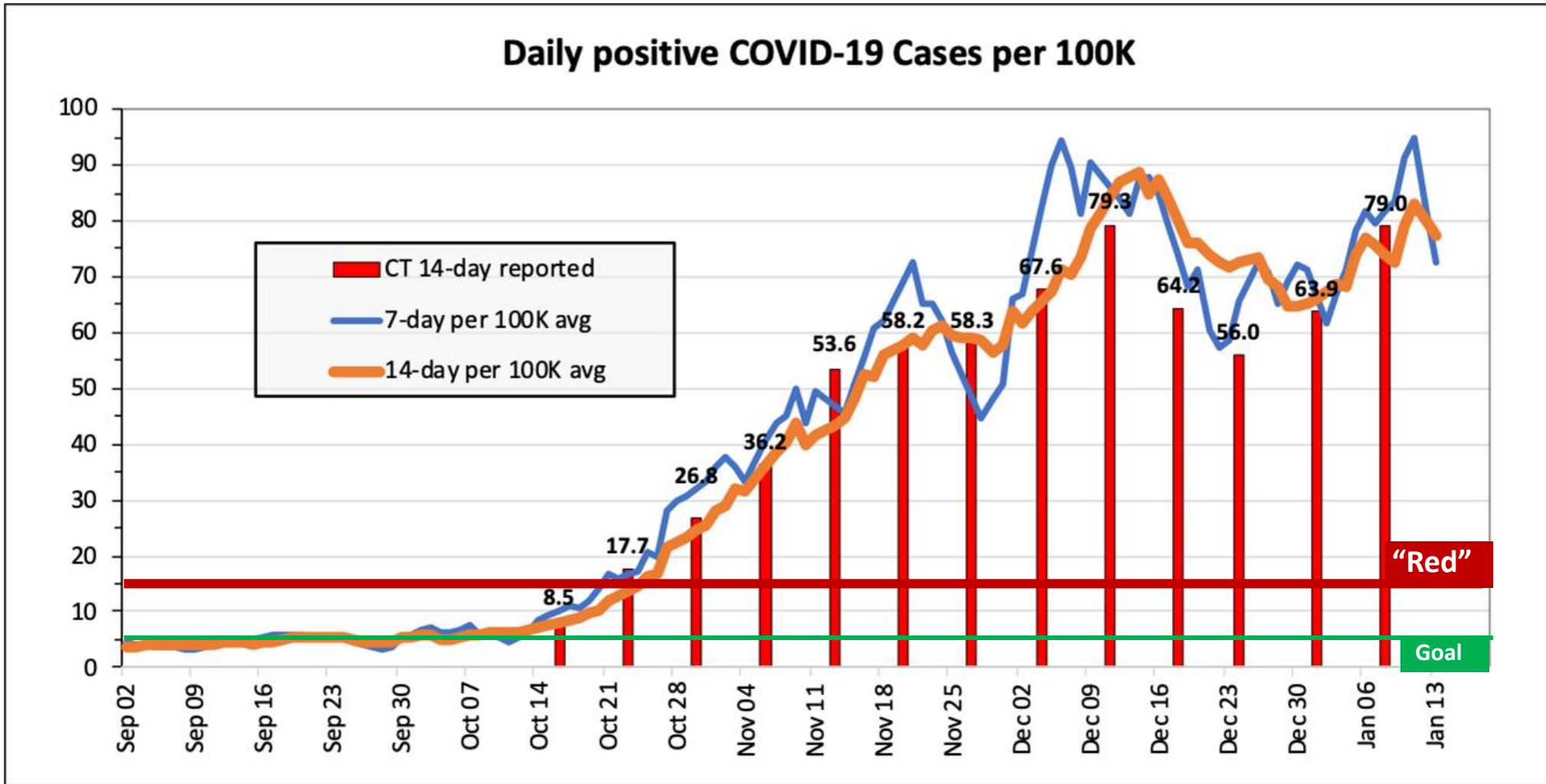

State of the City: COVID19 Case Trends

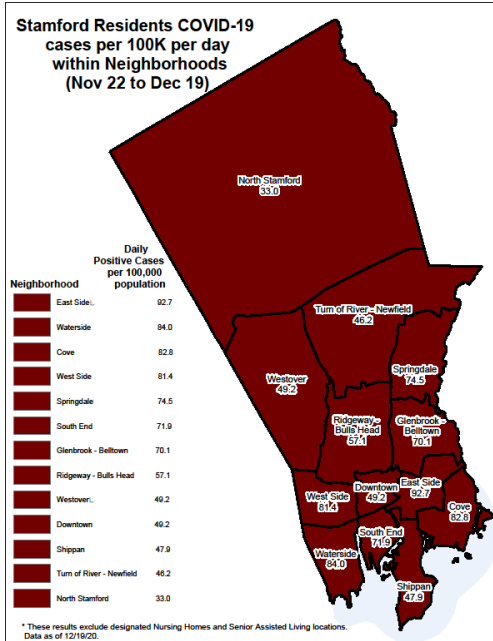

Red" with Coronavirus**

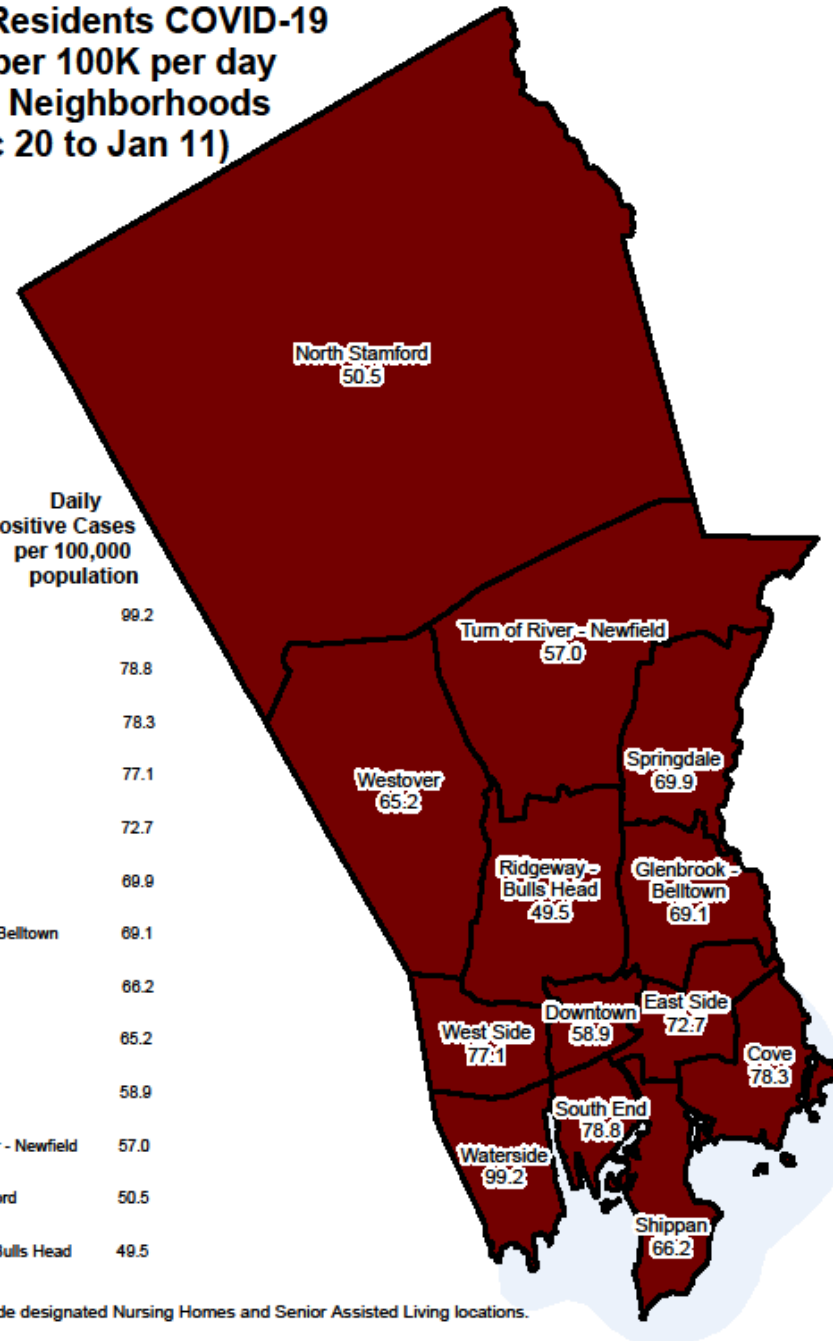


Last Neighborhood Map

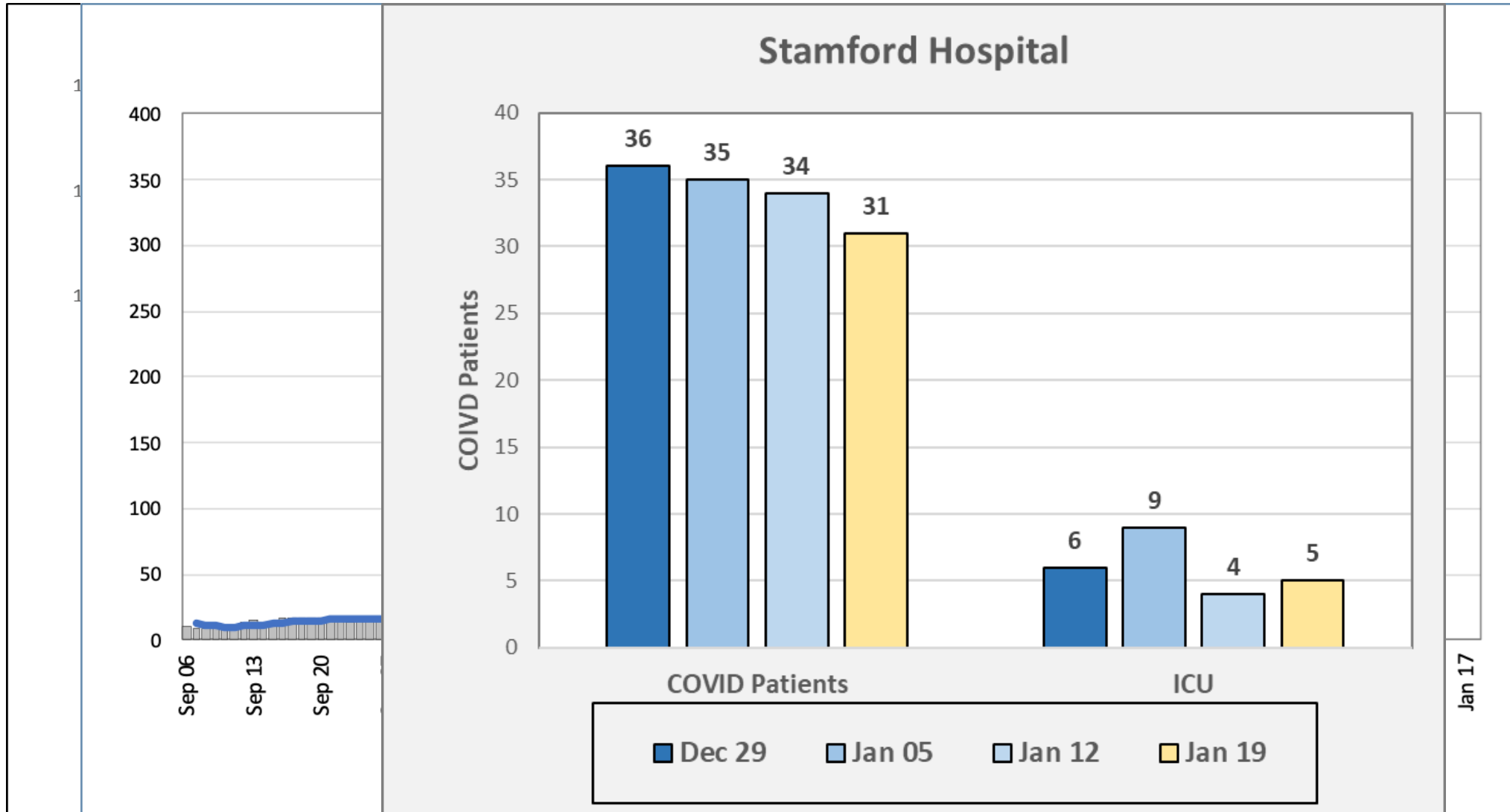

Hospitalization Rate

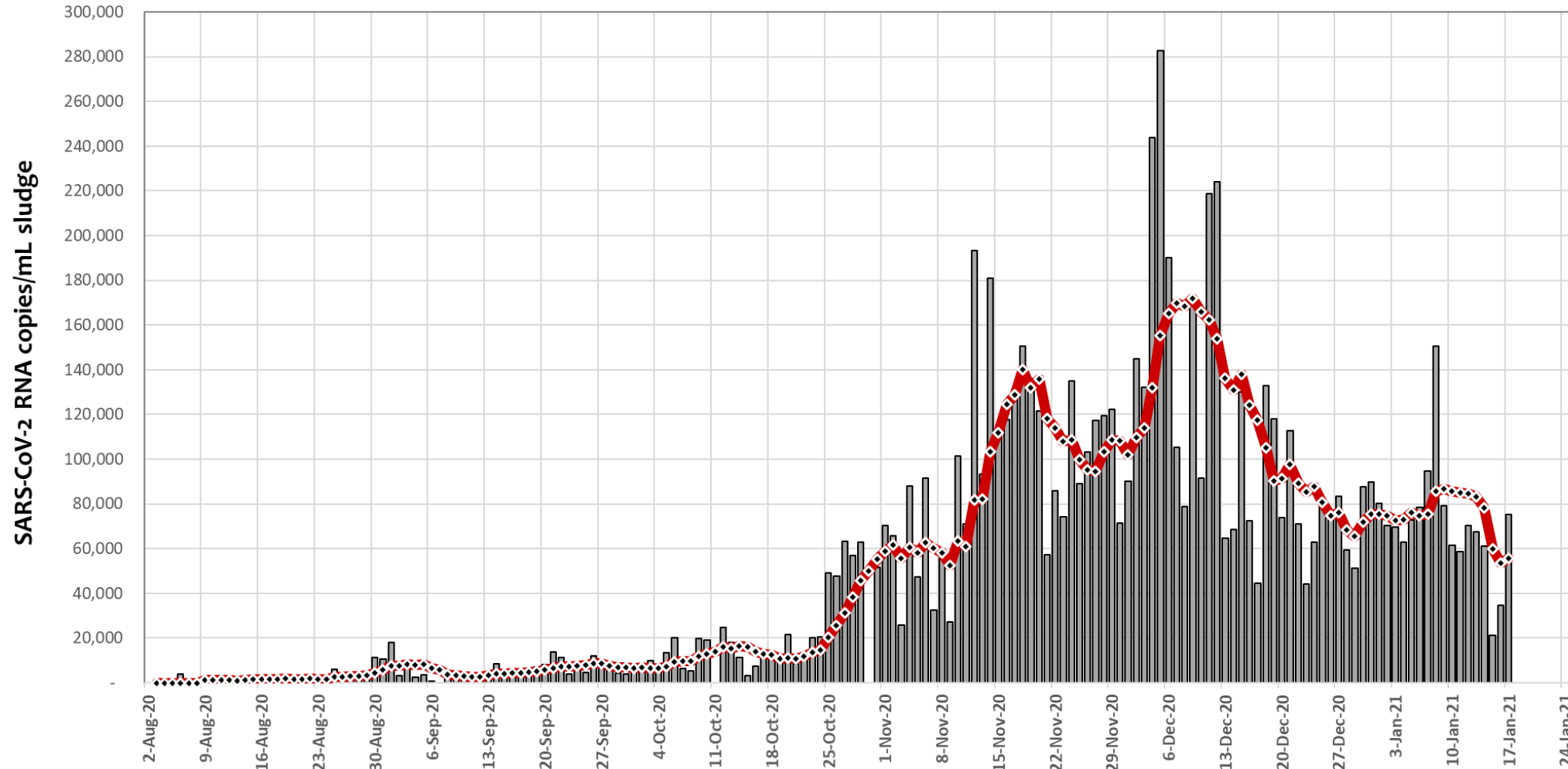

WPCA Wastewater COVID Concentration



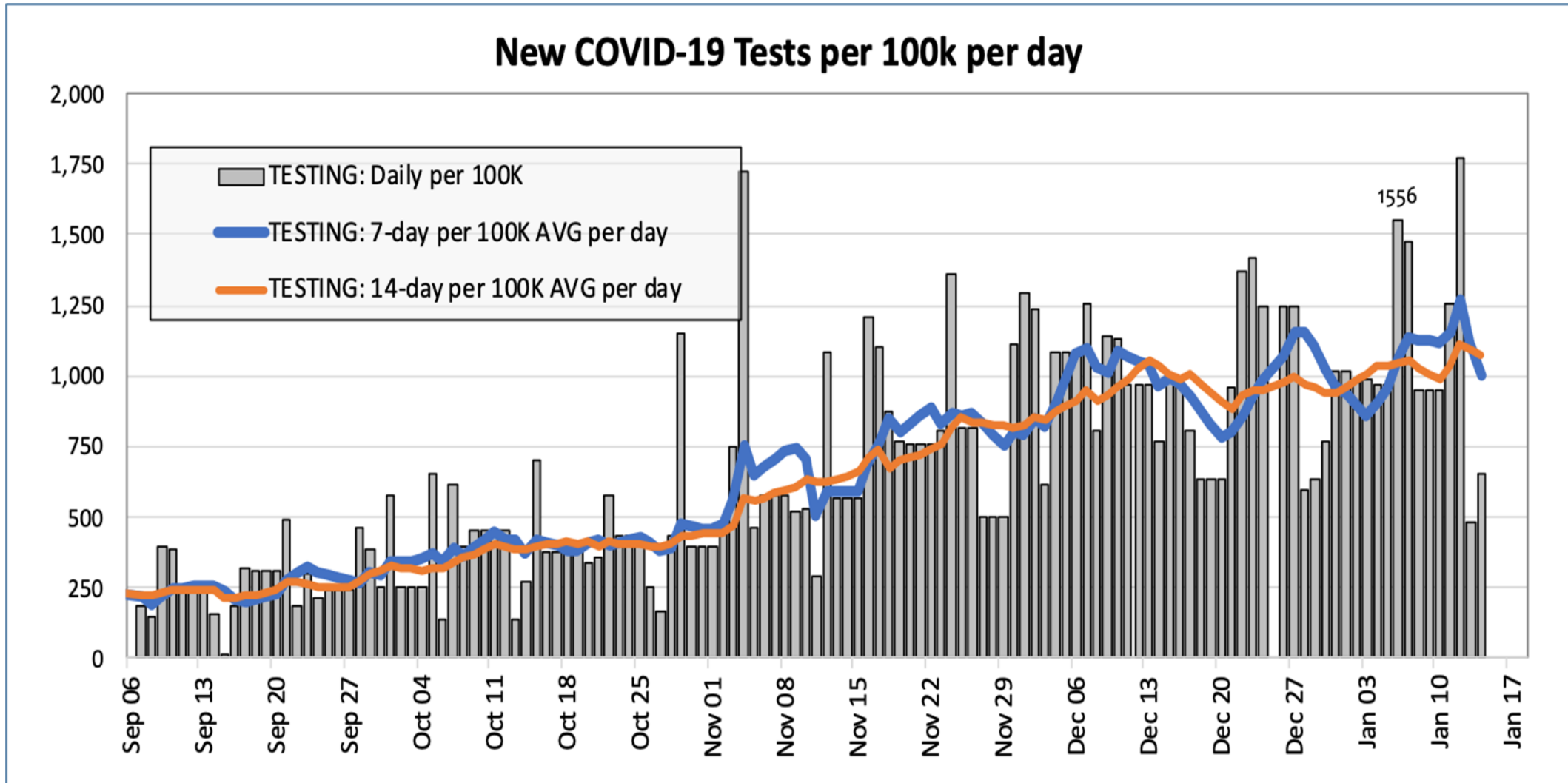
COVID Concentration in Stamford WPCA Wastewater



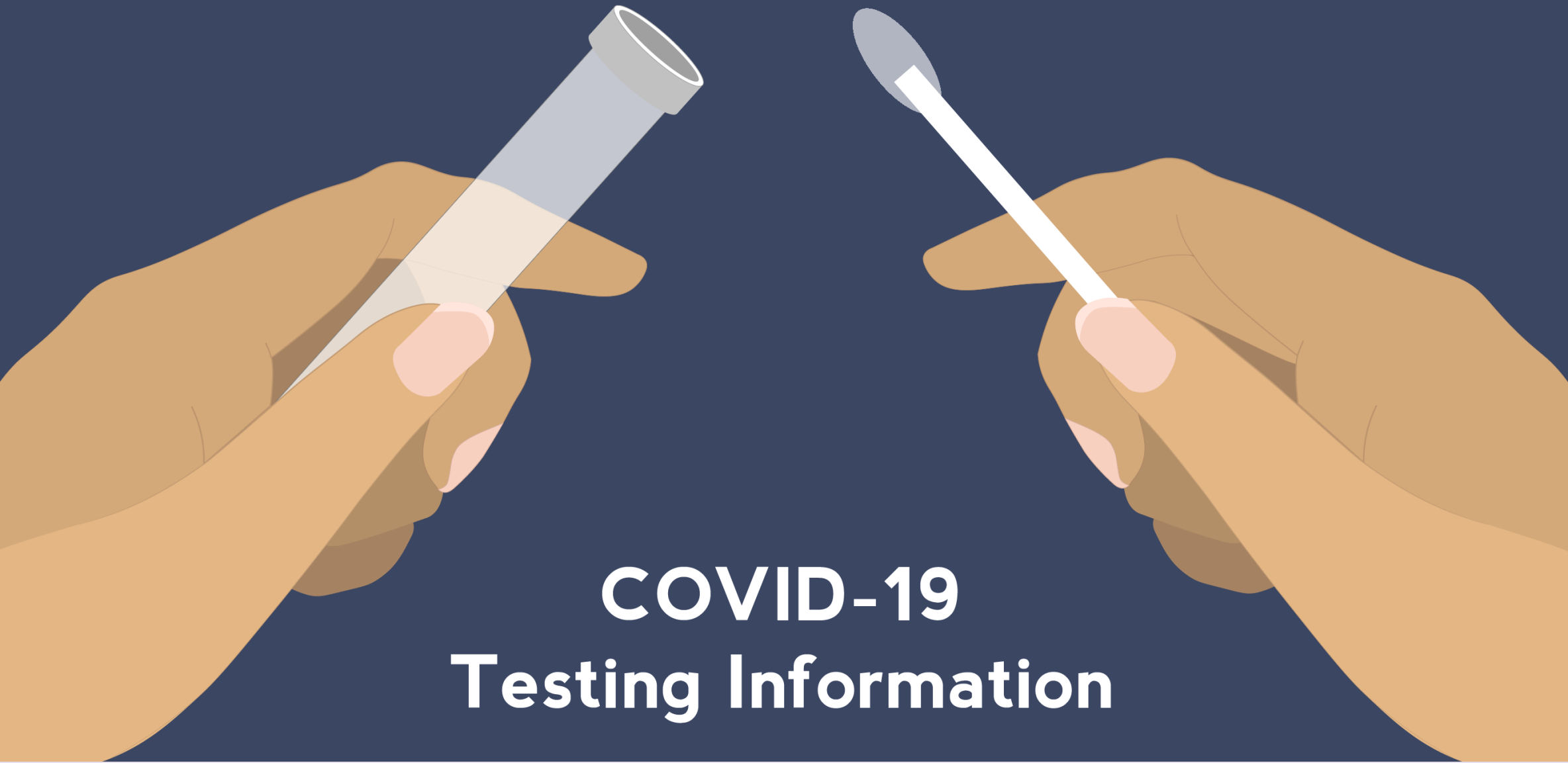
