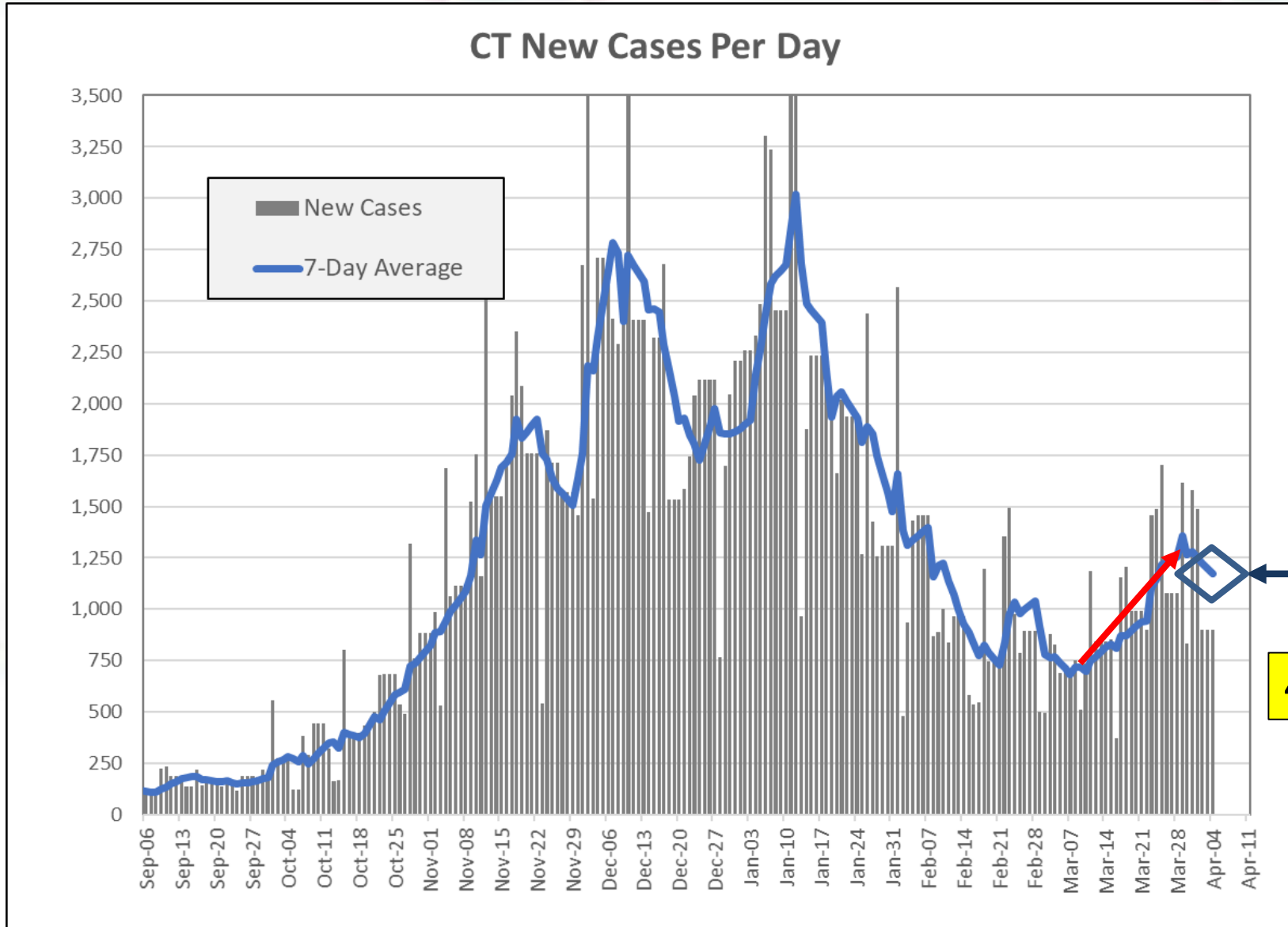

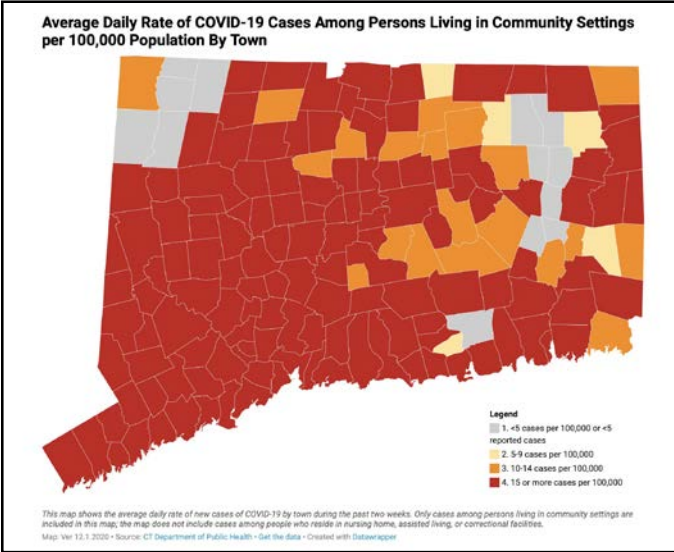

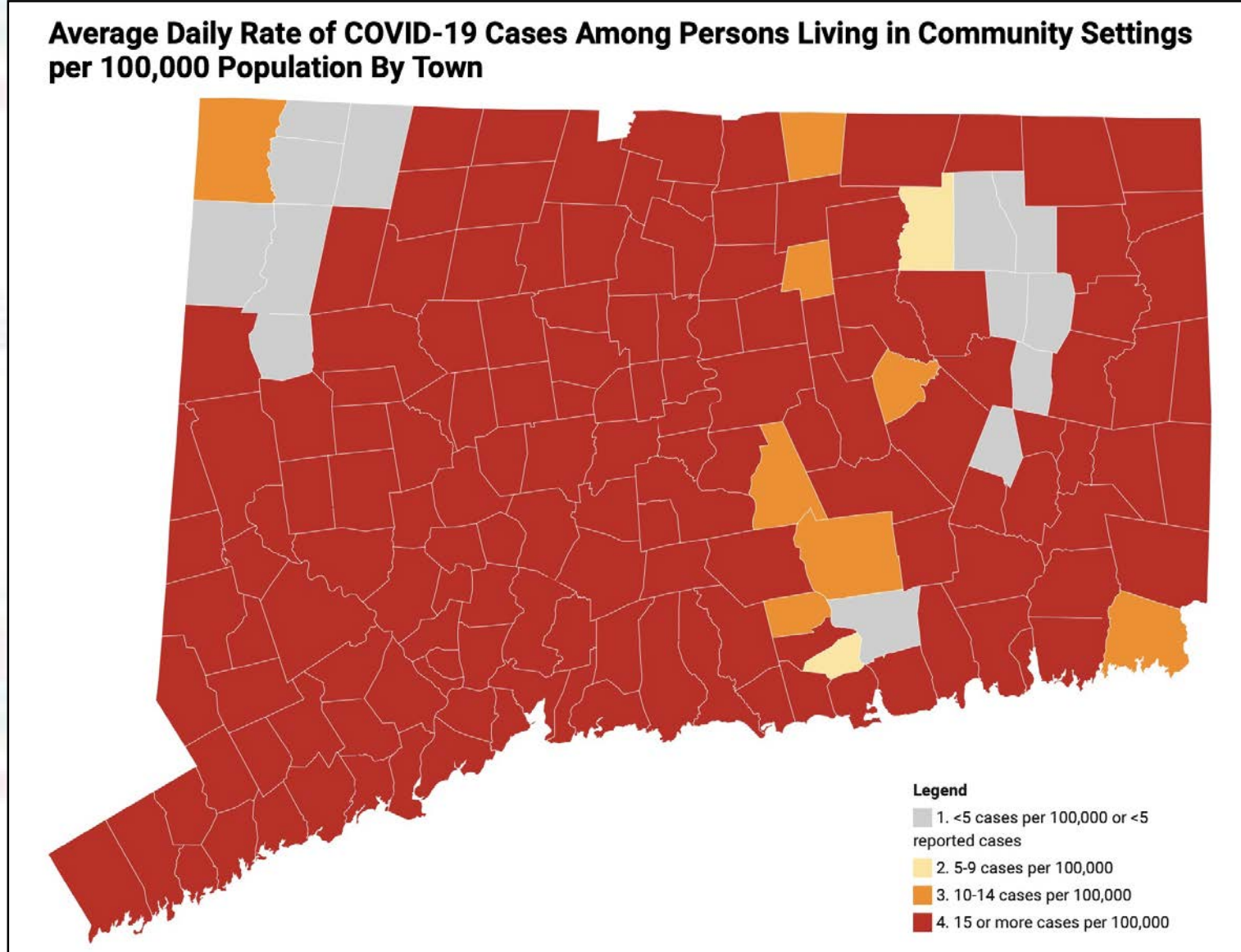

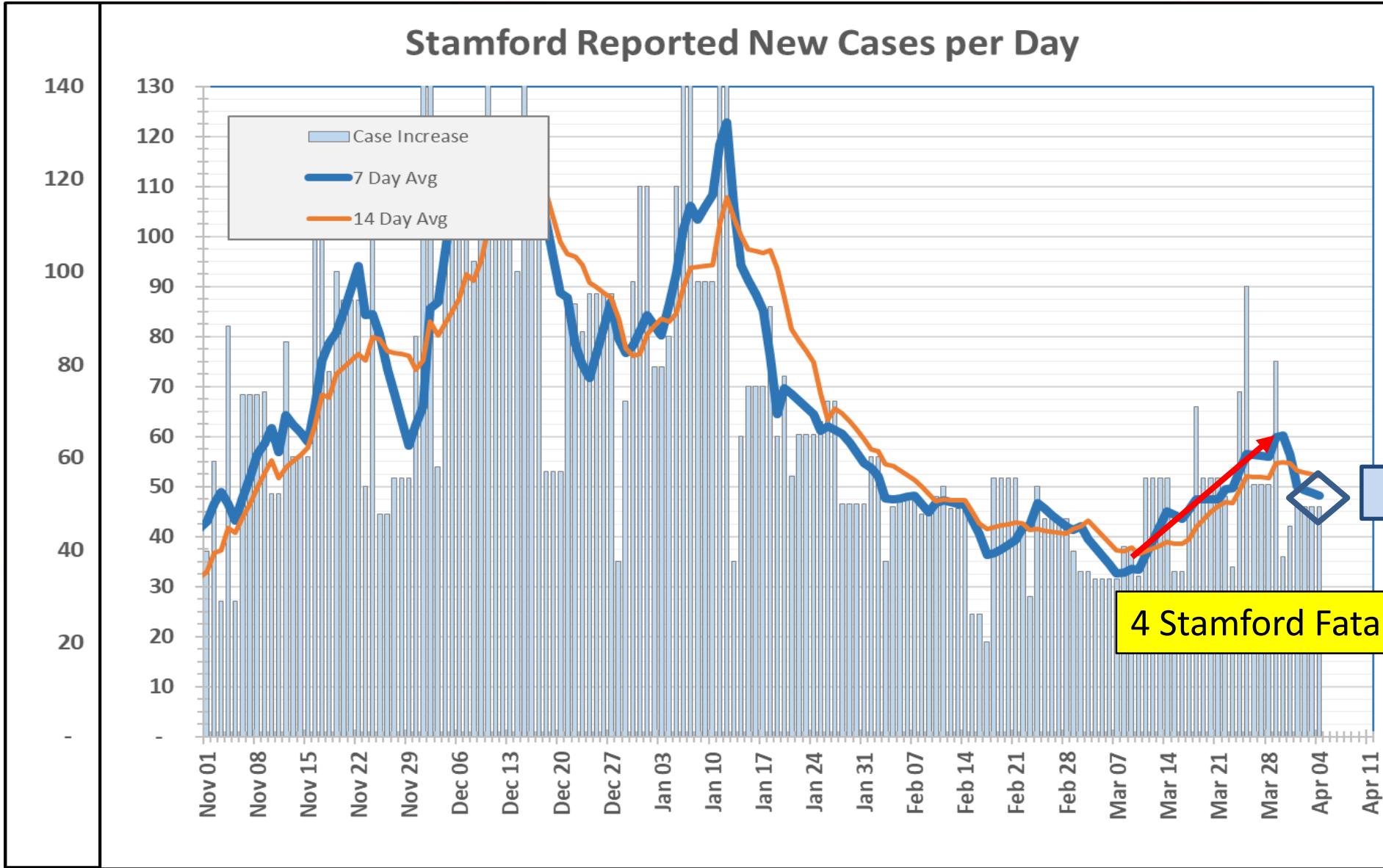

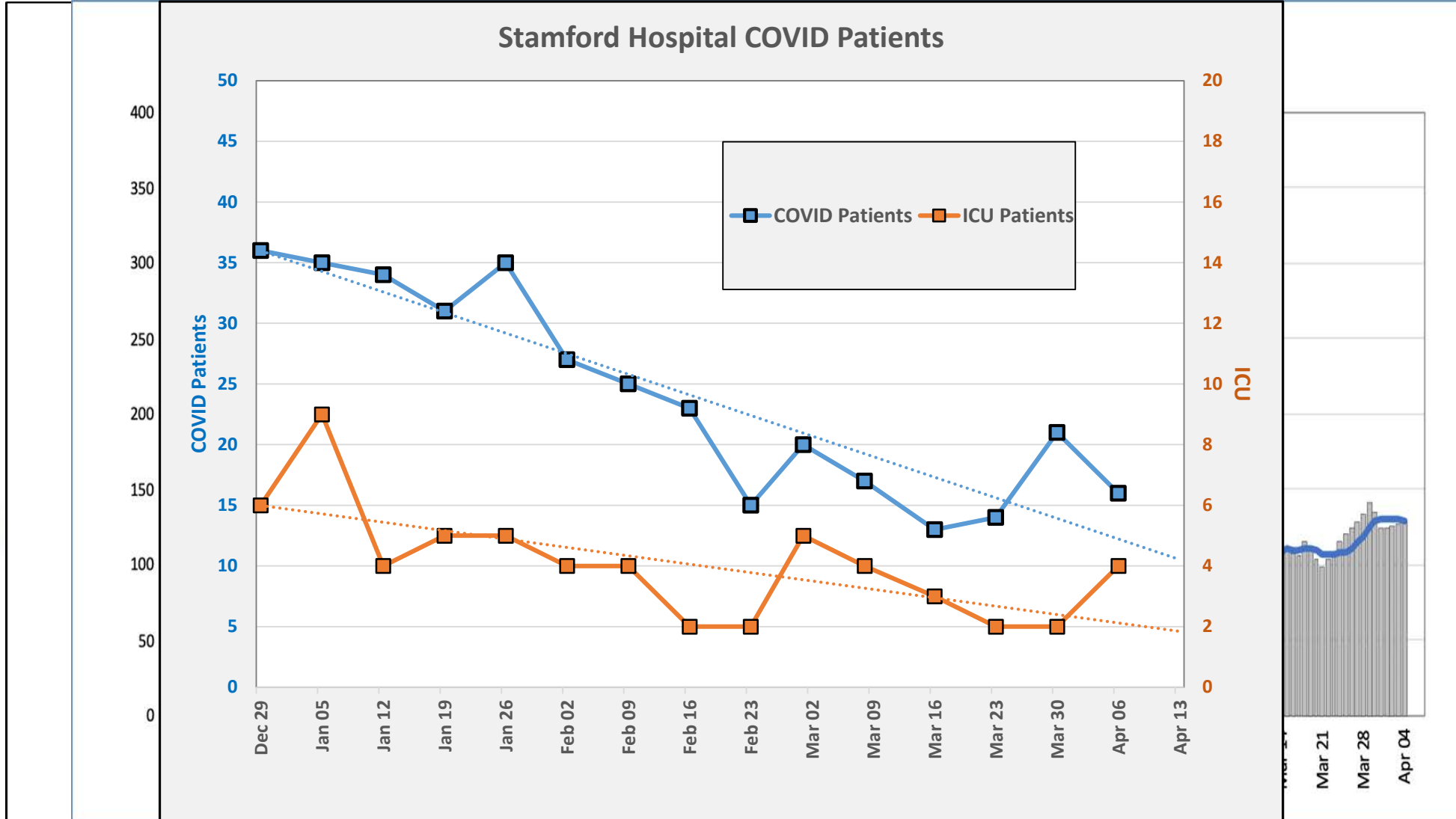

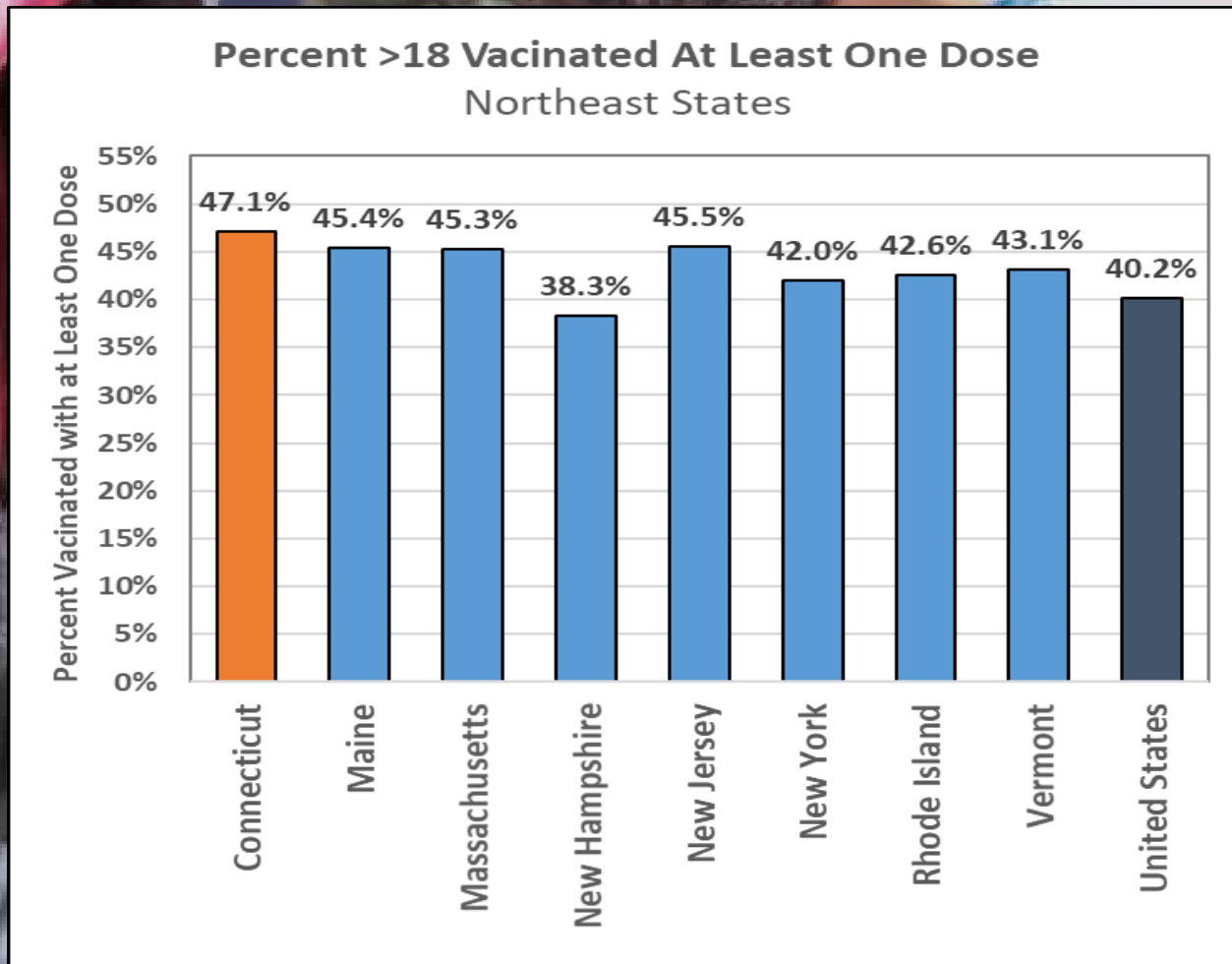

# State of Connecticut: Covid 19 Vaccination Rate



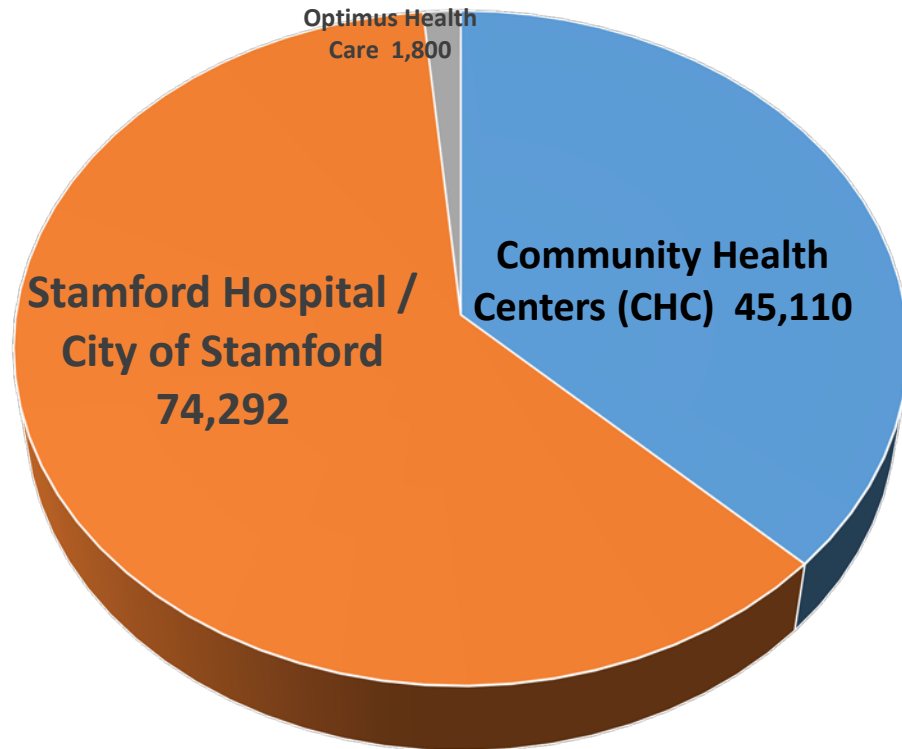

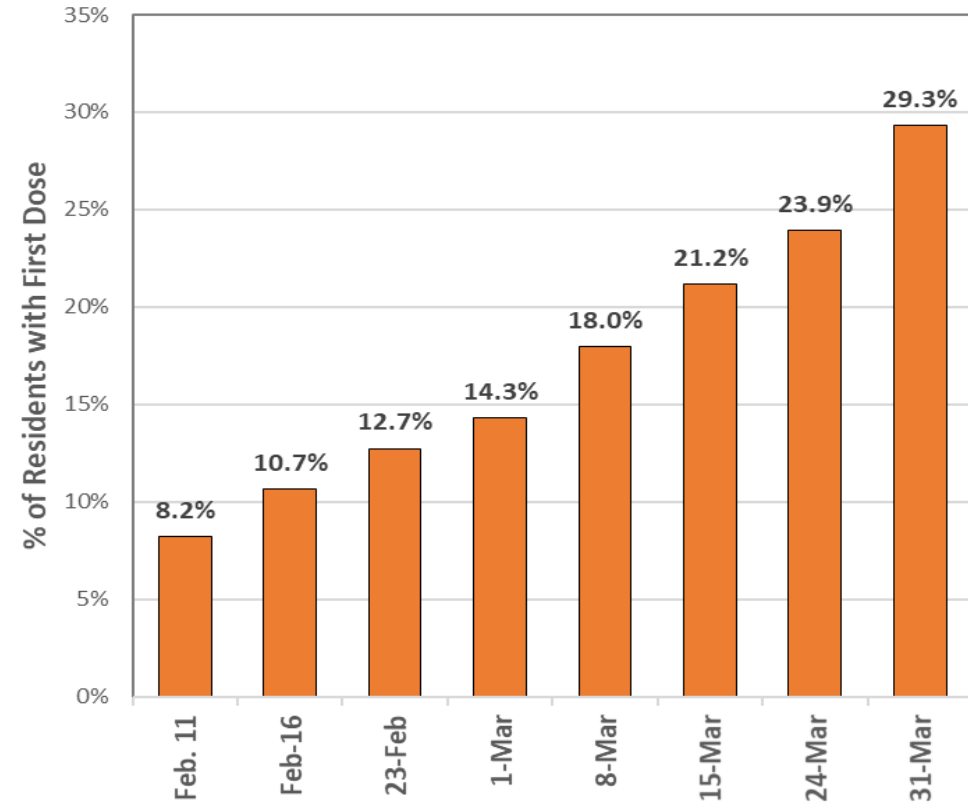

# Connecticut Vaccination Update

- April 1, 2021-- no age restriction
  - 16 and 17-year-old eligibility with parental consent
  - Scheduling at SH (Wheeler Building) and Elmcroft Site (Old Pitney Bowes Building)
- “Prioritize” high-risk conditions
  - Patients with five recognizable conditions by CHA
    - Chronic kidney disease on dialysis
    - Cancer on active chemo
    - Down syndrome
    - Sickle cell disease
    - Solid organ transplants
  - ACIP list of additional high-risk conditions
    - Obesity
    - Chronic lung disease
    - Diabetes
    - Dementia or chronic neurologic disease
    - Chronic heart disease
    - Immunosuppression, including HIV
    - Chronic liver disease
    - Pregnancy
    - Smoking or substance abuse





# Connecticut Vaccination Hospital Updates

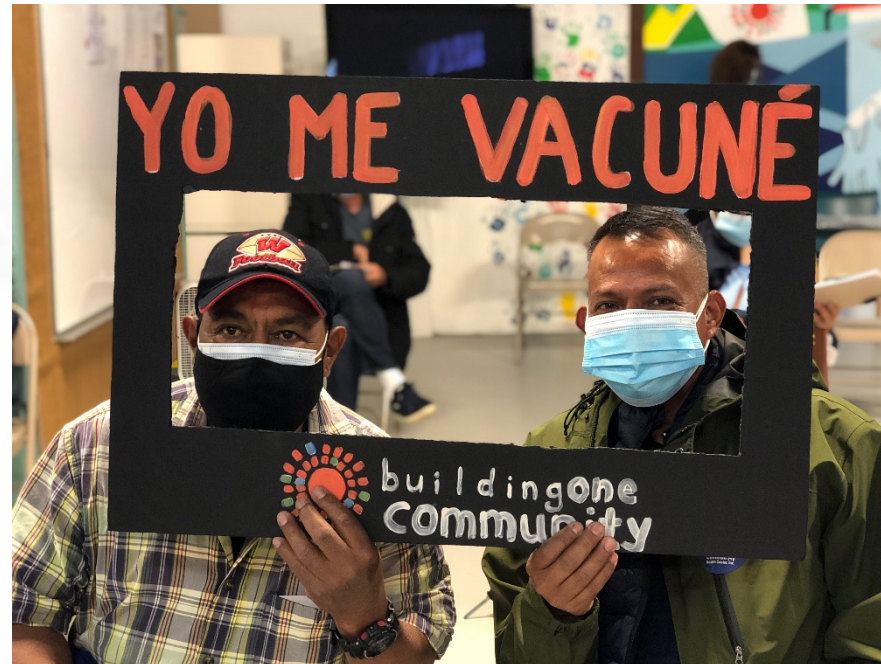
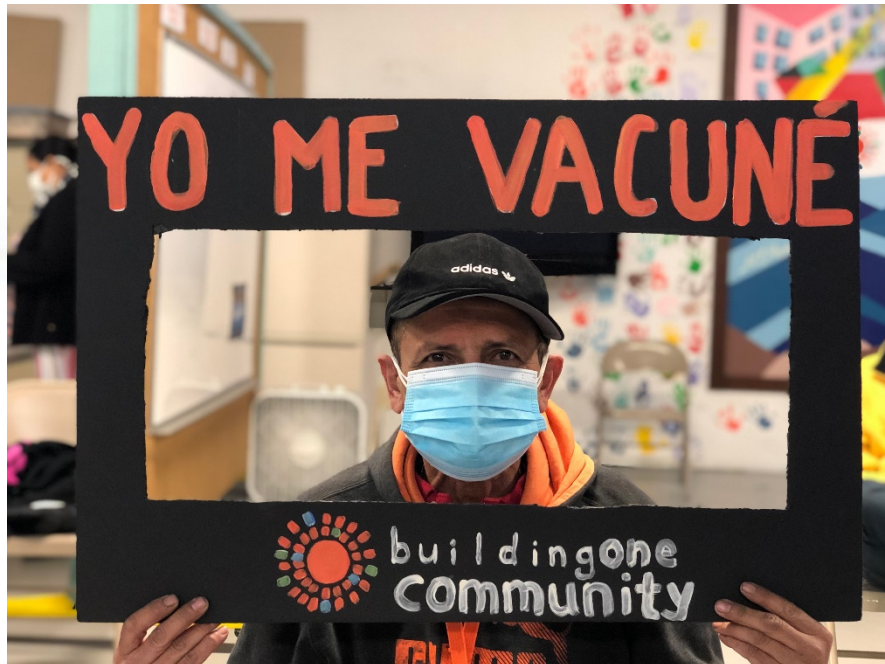
- “Prioritize” high-risk conditions
  - Many of these have already been vaccinated due to age phase-in
  - Memo to SH Providers to reach out to their patients to schedule ASAP
  - Communication directly to hematology and oncology, nephrology and dialysis teams
  - Direct phone calls and individual appointments to all patients with Down Syndrome and Sickle Cell disease
- Hospitals are being requested to explore administration of vaccine to inpatients
  - Successful pilot on acute Rehab floor very successful
  - Patient discharges to SNFs and ALFs to ensure LTCF patient coverage (J&J)
  - Consider vaccinating all patients on discharge of in ED when vaccine supplies are available (J&J)
- Reporting “vaccine” breakthrough cases to DPH and send clinical samples for detection of variants
- Manage vaccine end-of-day doses to minimize waste

## Suraj asks:

*“My parents are here as visitors in Connecticut. They are from India and do not hold any documents/identification for a Connecticut address. They are 60+ years old, are they eligible for the vaccine?”*

## Answer:

If your parents, children, or other family members are living with you during the pandemic they are eligible to receive the vaccine.

If you have special concerns like these you may call the City at (203) 977-4378 (M-F, 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.) to ask for scheduling assistance with our programs with Stamford Health.
